
Manus Noble - Classical Guitar Concert

Tellmi App promoted to students

We are pleased to announce a partnership with the Tellmi app which Mr Oakwood launched in assembly today. Below please find a letter from Tellmi to parents and carers explaining how the app works:

tellmi

Dear parents and carers,

One of the best ways for a young person to manage their wellbeing is to share how they are feeling. We are delighted to be partnering with your school to share our expertise and provide additional support for students. Your child can add their school when they register their account.

<u>Here</u> is a short video to explain how it works. Tellmi can be downloaded from Google Play & Apple App Store.

Tellmi is a multi-award winning, age-banded, peer support app that the NHS deems safe for people as young as 11. The app has been independently evaluated by the Evidence Based Practice Unit at University College London and is evidenced to improve mental health in young people.

Users can anonymously post about anything that is worrying them and receive supportive replies from other people of a similar age. All posts and replies are checked by trained moderators and are published within 30 minutes. High-risk posts are redirected to the in-house counselling team for immediate support.

Tellmi features a comprehensive support directory with over 600 resources and educational resources and users can access 24/7 crisis support in two clicks. Both the feed and directory can be filtered by topic, eg 'exams', 'friends', 'autism' which makes it easy for young people to join relevant conversations and access appropriate support.

"I actually didn't realise how much better this app can make someone feel. I love being able to ask my own questions and just the experience of trying to help even one other person helps me to feel happier too."—Tellmi User

Be Kind Awards - Opportunity to nominate

The Be Kind awards is a set of awards to celebrate kindness amongst schools and young people.

There are 7 award categories but categories 2, 4, 6 and 7 are relevant to us as a school

Secondary Star School

This can cover the whole school or a specific year group. Nominations must detail how kindness has been promoted and if possible the impact it has had on the pupils, the outside community and/or the staff

John Caudwell Community Kindness

This is for Individual pupils or groups of students in all year groups. The act of kindness must have been shown to the community, outside of school. Nominations must be able to demonstrate how their kindness has impacted the community

Star Pupil

This is for individual pupils from all year groups. The act of kindness must have been shown within a school environment. Nominations must be able to demonstrate how their kindness has impacted others

Star Teacher

This is to nominate a teacher that has gone above and beyond to demonstrate kindness. The act of kindness must have been carried out at school or for pupils outside of school. Nominations must be able to demonstrate how their kindness has impacted others

Nominations will be open from Monday 3rd July 2023 until Friday 12th April 2024.

Students logging on to their Talaxy accounts from home

If any of you are struggling to access your child's Talaxy account at home, please find some instructions below. There are two routes to use:

Route 1 - useful for all their school work

- Students must make sure when they log onto the computer, they are signed in on their school email account.
- They should then go to the following link

https://sites.google.com/stdunstansschool.com/stdunstansstudentgate way/home

- Once there, press the Talaxy link button.
- Then click 'Log In' located at the top right
- Then click 'Google' icon at the bottom right where it asks for login details.
- You do not have to sign in here if you are logged on with school email already, just click the google button and it will take you straight through

Route 2 - Talaxy only

Students should go to the following link below.

- Click 'Log In' located at the top right.
- The student will need to use their school email account to log on if they are not logged on to the computer already on their school account.

















