


### Year 7 Geography



### Staff Trip to the Bishop's Palace




Staff enjoyed an evening of festive lights and togetherness this week in order to support wellbeing.





Items left uncollected will eventually be donated.






Welcome to the Book Nook, the section of the newsletter where we update you with what has been happening in the Library.


