Welcome to this week's newsletter. The key themes this week have been around Remembrance and Recognition.

On Monday the whole school gathered in an act of Remembrance on Armistice Day. In a change to arrangements from previous years, we decided to bring the school together on the courts to share and participate in the 2 minute silence. Students from across the school were also invited to wear their Cadets, St John's Ambulance or Scouts Uniforms . This poignant moment of silence was observed impeccably by all, and the community reflected and considered the destruction, devastation and sacrifice brought about by war.

This has also been a week of recognition and celebration for our students too. At the start of the week, students were challenged to hit the 50,000 positive points threshold by the end of the week in order to receive a Non-Uniform day. We have all been very impressed with the amount of positive points students have received this term, which stands as one of the highest in the MNSP Trust. By the end of the week our students managed to achieve 55,000 positive points, exceeding our expectations. The day Non-Uniform was well received, expectations were observed and students also raised considerable sums of money for Children in Need.

During the week, we have also announced our long awaited Rewards and Recognition scheme. This is intended to encourage and recognise students who consistently work hard, make a positive contribution to the community and attend school regularly. Leading on from this, we created an anti-bullying pledge paper chain where the students recorded their ideas on strips of paper which we joined together to make a huge chain.
























#### **Strode College Experience Day**

Well done Year 11, we are proud of you all!


















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














**Book Review by Maggie (Year 9)**
