Happy New Year

Welcome back: As this is the first newsletter of the new year, I would like to welcome you all back to High Littleton Primary School following what I hope was a lovely Christmas period for you all.

Governor Open Days: On Tuesday and Wednesday of this week, we were delighted to invite members of our Governing Body along with Mr Alun Williams to school, so that they could observe the day-to-day running of the school. Governors visited all classrooms, observed lessons, spoke wih staff and children and also spent time on the playground and in Collective Worship. Feedback from the two days was very positive. It was clear to the Governors that routines and behaviour were excellent and that the quality of teaching and learning was of a high standard.

Accelerated Reader: If you are a parent of a child in Key Stage 2, you will have received a letter informing you of our plans to award certificates to children based on the amount of word read. Each time a child successfully completes a quiz, the system allocates the child the number of words which were read in the book. Therefore, as the children read more books and correctly answer quizzes, the number of words read increases. This will also hopefully spur children on to read more regularly at home and your support would be greatly appreciated.

Phonics: You may have seen our Instagram post earlier on this week which celebrated our success in the recent national Phonics Screening Check. The letter from the Minister for Schools, which can be seen within this newsletter, congratulates us as a school on achieving a 96% pass rate and places the school in the top 4% of schools in the country. My heartfelt thanks to the staff and parents for ensuring that the children achieved so well.

Attendance: You will no doubt be aware that school attendance has been in the news recently, with the government keen to improve attendance rates post-pandemic. We as a school are fortunate that you as parents place a great deal of emphasis on regular attendance and our average attendance (97.1%) since

September has been well above national

averages.

Hinduism Workshop: Today, children in Deer Class welcomed Mrs Indira Mistry, who worked with the children to develop their understanding of Hinduism and what it is to be a Hindu. The children thoroughly enjoyed their sessions and our grateful thanks Indira for visiting and sharing her knowledge.

I am writing to congratulate you on your school's outstanding achievement in the 2023 Phonics Screening Check.

We want to ensure every child develops a firm grasp of phonics as the basis on which to improve standards of reading. As such I was delighted to see your results.

With 96 per cent of pupils in Year 1 at High Littleton CofE VC Primary School meeting the expected standard in the check, your school is in the top 4 per cent of all primary schools in the country.

The latest figures show that 83 per cent of pupils who met the expected standard in the check went on to achieve at least the expected standard in reading at key stage 2 in 2023, which underlines the importance of developing the ability to decode words effectively at an early age.

Your particular success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a lifelong love of reading.

I would like to thank you for your commitment and success in this vital area of a child's early education and congratulate you, your staff and pupils again on all you have achieved.
