World Book Day takes place on Thursday 7th March. To celebrate this, there will be various activities taking place in school. Mr Griffith will launch World Book Day by reading one of his favourite stories to the whole school.

- We welcome back our infamous 'Dressing up Day'. We are inviting children to come to school dressed as a character from a favourite book using resources and materials you have at home; please do not buy anything. This could be a fictional character or you could even use a non-fiction book e.g. if you have a dinosaur encyclopaedia come dressed to school as a dinosaur or if you have a book about ballet dancing come dressed to school as a ballerina!
- We will be holding another 'Book Swap' session in each classroom. We would like each child to bring to school a book they no longer wish to keep (in good condition) to be swapped with a friend during the day. Class teachers will organise this in their own classrooms and children will have the opportunity to read their new book or share books with others. It is our aim that each child will bring home a new book to read at no cost.
- Children will carry out a book related activity in their own classrooms.
- Free Book Shop during morning playtime children will have the opportunity to choose a free book from a selection provided by the school. This will take place in Owl Class and will be in addition to their 'book swap' book!
- Each child will receive a World Book Day Token which will allow them to choose from a selection of free books or receive a £1 discount. Most local bookshops and supermarkets are participating in this so please do encourage your child to make use of their token. More information regarding this is available at World Book Day.
