It's been a very unusual couple of weeks for attendance. Several students and staff have been struck down by this winter flu bug – and we sincerely hope everyone feels much better very soon.

In spite of these challenges we have also seen some outstanding attendance across the school. Lots of pupils have continued to come in every day, showing real commitment and determination as we head towards the Christmas celebrations. Well done to you all!

We are also noticing an increase in parents responding to text messages from their child asking to be collected. It can be incredibly difficult for a parent to receive such a message, particularly if the child sounds upset or reports feeling unwell. We want to reassure you that as a school, it is absolutely never our intention to keep a student here if they are genuinely too unwell to continue with the day.

When a student reports feeling unwell, we follow a clear process: our staff will make an assessment and contact the family to work collaboratively towards the best outcome for your child. To ensure the safety and well-being of all children and to make sure we are always making the right decisions concerning their health and education, we ask for your vital support in adhering to this established process. This process can sometimes be tricky and we ask for everyone's cooperation in following this procedure and working with us in the future.

On Monday, we were delighted to find that 242 students achieved 100% attendance throughout November. A huge well done to every one of them. As part of our monthly attendance rewards, 15 students have been randomly selected to receive Amazon vouchers — these will be on their way shortly.

Alongside the November 100% Club, we also introduced a three-week attendance streak as a pre-Christmas treat — and then the flu bug hit. Despite its best efforts, an impressive 238 students have maintained 100% attendance over the past three weeks, and the challenge still has one more week to go. At the moment, 278 students are still in the running to complete the next three-week streak and be in with a chance of winning.

Tutor groups are also taking part in a series of quizzes and enjoying a 'riddle a day' for the rest of the term. Several students will be receiving prizes, with even more to come in the final fortnight. A number of tutor groups are currently in the running for the non-uniform day challenge for Friday 12th December – but with this flu bug circulating, it's still very much all to play for!

So, with just two weeks to go until Christmas, we want to thank all our parents and families for their continued support. Your encouragement, communication and partnership make a huge difference — especially during a busy term and a challenging spell of winter illness. We are incredibly proud of our students' resilience and commitment, and we look forward to finishing the term positively together.


PTA Fundraising







