#### Welcome

A welcome to our new families and welcome back for our returning Critchill families.

September is always a joy at Critchill with new students, class groups and staff building relationships and getting to know each other. Senior leaders have been into lessons and observed, first-hand, students accessing high quality teaching through a range of personalised learning activities. I observed learners testing kitchen roll for absorbency, making Carbonara, recreating a black hole, independently washing and ironing uniforms; all of these activities whilst being taught their Personal Learning Intentions as outlined on their PLIM Maps.

## Attendance

Pupil attendance at Critchill School continues to surpass national bench-marking figures for Special Schools; we are proud of this and grateful for the huge role that our parents and carers play in relation to this. At Critchill School we continue to provide our pupils with access to a profoundly personalised curriculum and there is a correlation between pupils with higher attendance and sustainable progress made in their personalised curriculums.

This term, we have seen a rise in Unauthorised Absences. We have a duty to contact parents and put action plans in place to improve attendance where there is a fall in attendance or where there is not appropriate supporting documentation. We want to support pupils and families to be able to attend school in order that the curriculum can be accessed and progress can be made and sustained over time.

Please be reminded of the importance of arriving at school on time, missing just 10 minutes a day will equate to over 31 hours of lost learning time throughout an academic year.

## EYFS & KS1

## Wrens

This term we have been exploring the theme 'Under the Sea'. We have engaged in a range of activities including sensory stories, making salt dough starfish and using our new floor projector!

## **Bramblings**

This term we have been learning about Pirates! Through Attention Autism we have explored what a pirate is, how they travel, maps and where you can find them. Through English, we have been exploring props from sensory stories, matching these to symbols and sentences. In maths, we have been looking at numbers and have done some excellent counting!

## **Nuthatches**

This term we had the most brilliant time being little pirates. The children have made their own treasure, maps and pirate ships. We have listened to sea shanty songs to help us focus on our

work in class. In Maths we have been learning numbers and placing value using different objects from the pirates treasure. We have practised addition with jewels and coins, and subtracted by having some pirates walk the plank. We have explored different shapes to help us to build our own pirate ship as well. In English we have been discovering new words and composing sentences using the funbooks: "Pirate Pete and His Smelly Feet" – to keep those snappy sharks away; and "Pirates Love Underpants" with a rhyming story to feed our imagination. Well done everyone for this fabulous half-term exploring the world of pirates – you all worked so hard and made progress in your learning to become more independent.































#### **Finches**

This term we have been doing lots of wonderful art work linked to our theme. We have been collaging rainbows out of different materials and decorated and made our own 'pencils' to go on the front of our art books as well as exploring colours and which colours make us feel happy.

## **Starlings**

This term we have been learning about Materials Around Us. Students have enjoyed getting creative with lots of different types of materials including making tin robots, paper mache bowls, nature wreaths and stained-glass cookies!

#### **Owls**

This term have been learning about 'Materials Around Us' focussing on a different material each week. We have conducted science experiments and created a range of art projects using varying materials. A firm favourite was our pumpkins made of yarn, and stained glass windows!

#### **Ravens**

This term we have been exploring the life cycle of a star and black holes. We made our own black holes and it got very messy! The children used task lists to undertake their PLIM work, great job Ravens!

#### **Kestrels**

On 7th October Kestrels Class had two people from Frome Town Council to talk to them about the Young People's Grant Project. Students were asked to share their opinions on how money is spent on Young People's Project within Frome. Students all shared their ideas and participated in a vote, deciding on which project they thought deserved the funding.

On the 14th October some of Kestrels Class represented Critchill School at Frome Town Hall. The students participated in a discussion with students from other schools about how the money should best be spent. The students came up with their own idea for how the money should be spent and presented their idea to the other groups, the students showed great confidence when talking in front of the other students. Students were then asked to vote their preferred

idea. Kestrels Class had a lovely time and enjoyed having a say in how their community will be improved.






















































## Working Futures - KS4 & P16

#### **Hawks**

This half term Hawks class have been learning about Romeo and Juliet and finding out about the country of Italy. Pupils have engaged in making a range of Italian dishes and showed great persistence with tasting these foods. # Important Parent Information

## **Car Park**

As it's the new school year, we want to remind families of the car park usage that follows our Risk Assessment for student safety.

- Where possible, please park off site and walk to collect students.
- If you use the car park, you must be entitled to and have a blue badge displayed
- Entry to the car park for parents/carers will not be until 8.40am/ 3.10pm and you may be asked to leave if you enter before these times.
- Please ensure parking is within allocated spaces and if there are no spaces you exit the car park and do not circle around the car park.

- Parking is not permitted on yellow hatched areas/on zig-zag lines.
- Please do not use the transport bays at pick up and drop off.
- Once your child is dropped off/collected please move off site to allow other parents access to designated spaces

We thank you in advance for your co-operation, to ensure the car park is able to remain open to parents, where needed.

### Weather

As the weather begins to change please can you ensure your child has an appropriate coat and waterproofs in school to enable them to access their learning. Much of the time our curriculum takes us outside and it's important that the students have clothing so they can stay warm and dry.

#### Headlice

We have seen an increase in cases of head lice in school. It is important to check your child's hair for head lice.

The best technique is to use a head lice comb when the hair is wet, leaving in conditioner and combing the hair in sections. When the hair is wet, head lice cannot move so they are easier to comb out. Please note that they do not jump or fly, you can only catch head lice from head to head contact. If you find head lice, you should:Treat appropriately: the wet combing technique eradicates the lice and eggs. This should be done every 3 to 4 days over a 2-week period to break the life cycle. You can help to tackle this by following good prevention, by being vigilant to spot any new infections or re-infections and by seeking prompt treatment if you find any head lice. Head lice are best prevented and controlled by regular wet combing, and keeping long hair tied up.

Please make sure that all parentpay accounts are all paid and up to date. School meals are **NOW** available to book up until Christmas. If you would like your child to have these the first week back after half term, then please book them by **Thursday 30th October.**
