Strong community links, including a village day, horticultural bulb show, local visitors to the school and performances and services at St Augustines help pupils develop a sense of wider community and belonging. We also work closely with a local residential home.



School Organisation.

We have seven teachers at Clutton Primary School and six classes. Mrs Cowgill , is KS1 phase leader and deputy headteacher, and supports Miss Ennew as part of the leadership team. Mrs Morris covers our PPA time, alongside Mrs Sebright, our HLTA.

We have mixed age classes in years 4,5 and 6. Our curriculum is reviewed every two years to ensure pupils don't repeat topics. Children in these years are taught in separate year groups for History, Geography, Science and Computing.

Learning support assistants work alongside class teachers in the morning, and run interventions in the afternoon. Not all classes have a full time LSA, as this is based on the needs of the children, and is reviewed every term
