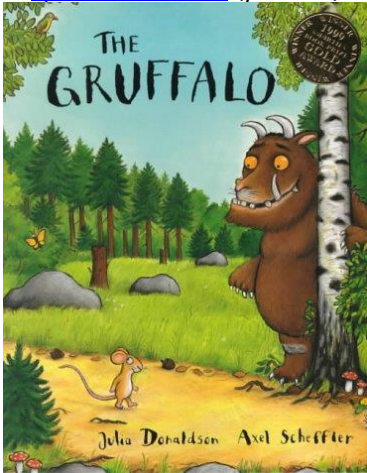

Using descriptions from mouse to describe the Gruffalo such as 'He has terrible tusks, and terrible claws' Can they label a picture of the Gruffalo?

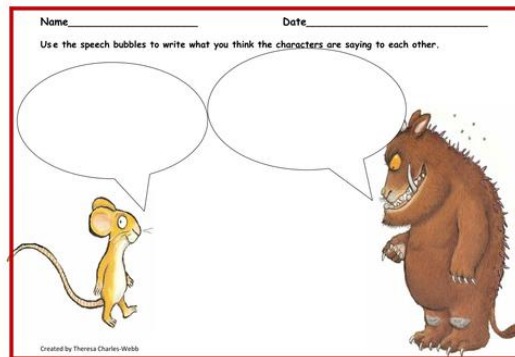

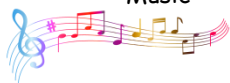
