If you roll a 4 and an 6, for example, your best answer would be 64. Using 3 dice, a roll of 3, 5 and 2 should give you 532, and so on. Write down your answer, pass the dice, and challenge the next player to "Beat That!"</p> <p>For a change, try making the smallest number possible! This is a great game for reinforcing the concept of place value.
