Tests can be booked online through the NHS <u>testing and tracing for coronavirus website</u>, or ordered by telephone via NHS 119 for those without access to the internet. Staff in schools have priority access to testing.

If a test is negative, if they feel well and no longer have symptoms similar to coronavirus (COVID-19), they can stop self-isolating. Other members of their household do not need to self isolate if double jabbed or under 18yrs 6 months unless they have symptoms.

If a test is positive they should follow the <u>'stay at home:</u> guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection' and must continue to self-isolate for at least 7 days from the onset of their symptoms and then return to school only if they do not have symptoms other than cough or

contact point and will keep in regular contact to offer support. LMB will remind line managers that they will be single point of contact should a member of staff, or their family become unwell and suspect Covid-19.

If staff have symptoms or have tested positive for coronavirus, they usually need to isolate for at least 10 days. If they are well enough, they should set work.

Under new guidance, there is no need for those who are in the bubble to self isolate if they are fully vaccinated unless they show symptoms. Those who have been in close contact will be advised by NHS Test and Trace and advised to take a PCR test. Staff who do not need to isolate should continue to attend school as normal - they are not required to wear a face covering but will be advised to so.
