Dear Parents and Carers,

Every year at St. Dunstan's School, students enjoy five days of fun-filled enrichment in which they can choose from a range of trips and school based activities. Enrichment week takes place during the last week of term each year. It is a central part of our Character Education programme, as the week provides all of our students in Years 7-9 with the opportunity to develop and build skills, knowledge and competences that are underpinned by our 5 Track values.

We commit to activities that enrich the curriculum and help to make learning relevant. These provide a different perspective and encourage openness to new and often challenging experiences. We seek to offer a comprehensive programme of activities that broadens student horizons and enhances cultural capital. During this week, our Year 10 students have Work Experience, providing them with the opportunity to gain an invaluable insight into the world of work. We believe that this is an essential part of their character journey, which sets them up for life beyond St Dunstan's, enabling them to make better future choices so that they can achieve their ambitions.

This year our activities will be taking place between the 15^{th} and 19^{th} July and we have prioritised areas of enrichment so that all students have the opportunity to develop socially, emotionally, build self-esteem and confidence and consolidate the skills that underpin our core values.

Key information:

- SOME ACTIVITIES INCUR COSTS DUE TO TRAVEL, ENTRANCE FEES OR EXTERNAL PROVIDERS. All COSTS ARE ESTIMATES UNTIL FINAL NUMBERS ARE CONFIRMED.
- SOME ACTIVITIES OR TRIPS MAY NOT BE ABLE TO RUN IF SUFFICIENT NUMBERS ARE NOT MET.
- A description of all activities can be found below. Annual School Camp and the Duke of Edinburgh award expedition also take place during this week and student places are already booked for these activities.
- Those students entitled to Pupil Premium funding can receive 25% off any trips that incur a cost. This is part of our focus on inclusivity so that everyone can have the best experience with limitless ambition.
- Once the 22nd April deadline is met, students will be allocated to activities on a provisional basis. Submitting the form before this date does not create any priority. All students who submit their form before the deadline will be treated equally with regards to allocation.
- As stated above, students submitting their choices after the 22nd April deadline will be considered late and will have their allocations made after all other students.
- Some activities have a maximum number of spaces; therefore, once a student has been allocated a
 provisional place for this activity, they will be given key information from the trip leader and will need to
 return a signed consent form.
- Students signed up to Camp do NOT need to complete the above form.
- Returning the consent forms to school then secures a place for this activity. All forms will be distributed to students at the same time and parents / carers will be informed when this has occurred.
- Please be aware that external trip availability may be dependent on behaviour points.
