## Key Achievements to date until July 2023:

## Sporting events and extra curricular activities

- Over 70% of KS2 have attended at least one sporting event.
- 90% of SEND children in KS2 have attended at least one sporting event.
- 73% of PP children in KS2 have attended at least one sporting event.
- 84% of children in Year 6 have attended at least one sporting event.
- Nearly 70% of KS2 have attended a sports club.
- 70% of PP and SEND children have attended a sports club this year.

#### Widening Opportunities

- Teachers and children in all year groups have worked with and alongside coaching specialists (tennis coaches and gymnastics coaches). - Excellent CPD
- Girls attended three different football tournaments as well as participating in a cup.

### **Promoting Active Lifestyles**

- Moki bands have proved popular with children an adults as a way of tracking and monitoring activity levels
- Year 4 have successfully walked 4.2 miles every Wednesday to attend their swimming lessons.

## Using sport for whole school improvement

We have had sports coaches working with children with sensory and emotional & social needs.

#### Areas for further improvement

- Increase KS1 sports club attendance from 64%
- Alm for 100% of KS2 attending a least one sporting event
- Aim for 100% of KS2 attending a sports club
- Include more adventurous activity into our offer for example Baskervilles Parkour.
- develop use of moki bands to target children, groups and structure of the day/week.
- Continue to develop links with a range of local clubs gymnastics, football, rugby, swimming, tennis, climbing etc.
- Continue to develop the use of sport and activity for whole school improvement.
