In reading, 74% of our children met the expected standard whilst in maths and writing, 81% and 85% of our children met the expected standard respectively. On average, 48% of our children achieved the higher score in reading and maths.

These are great results and are a testament to the hard work of the children and staff.

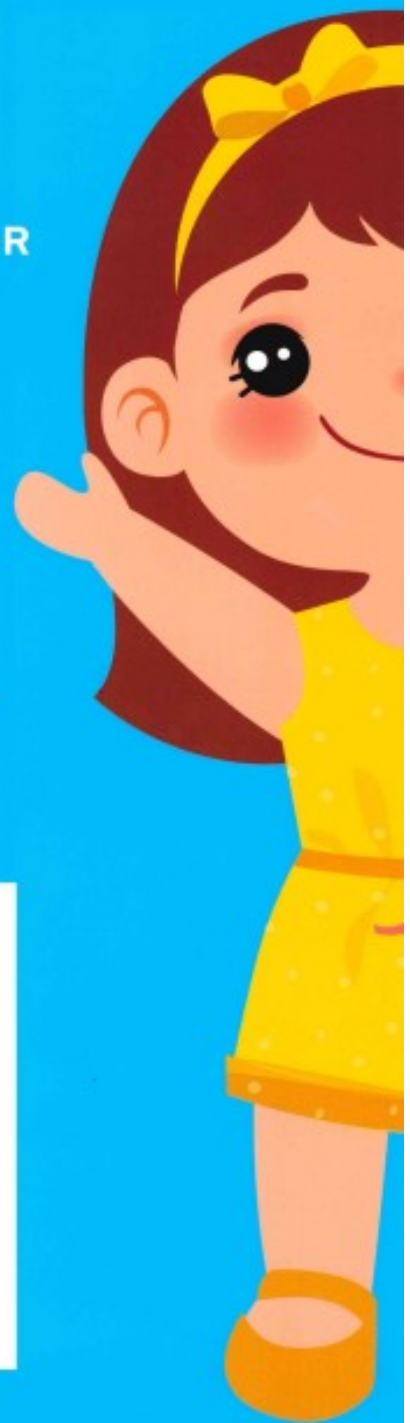
