Year 1 Phonics: Last week, children in Hedgehog Class took part in the annual Phonic Screening Check. We found out this morning that 100% of the children passed and this is testament to their hard work along with the determination of staff to ensure that we maintain the highest of standards.

Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check: Another year group to take on the challenge of a formal test are children in Otter Class, who have been practising their times tables recall for the past few months. Again, our results were high with children averaging 23/25. Over 50% also scored full marks (25/25) with almost 90% scoring 20/25. Again this is down to the hard work of children and staff, along with parental support, in ensuring that the children do as well as they can.

Summer Fair: Many thanks to our hard working members of the PTA for organising such a wonderful summer fair last Saturday. Thank you to those of you who attended and spent all your hard-earned money on various stalls and inflatables. Although not yet official, we believe that the PTA have raised approximately £2000.

Quadkids: Huge congratulations to our Year 5/6 Quadkids team, who attended a recent event held at St Benedict's School for schools in the Midsomer Norton area. Of all the schools who participated, we came first! This allowed the team to enter into the county finals which were held last week. A


