Key Stage 2 SATS 2022

Dear Parents and Carers,

SATs Tests for Year 6 pupils will take place between Monday 9th May and Thursday 12th May 2022.

During this week, children will sit tests in:

- Reading
- Maths
- Spelling, punctuation and grammar

Timetable of tests

Monday 9 th May 2022	Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar: Paper 1- Short Answer (45 minutes)
	Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar: Paper 2- Spelling Test (15 minutes)
Tuesday 10 th May 2022	Reading (1 hour)
Wednesday 11 th May 2022	Maths Paper 1: Arithmetic (30 minutes)
	Maths Paper 2: Reasoning (40 minutes)
Thursday 12 th May 2022	Maths Paper 3: Reasoning (40 minutes)

How will Key Stage 2 SATs be marked?

All of the test papers are sent away to be marked. Children will be given standardised scores for Reading, Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar and Maths. In order to achieve the expected standard at the end of Key Stage 2 your child will need to achieve a standardised score of 100. Results will be shared with parents in the end of year report.

How will my child be assessed in writing?

Writing is teacher assessed using descriptors set by the government. In order to achieve the expected standard, children's work must show examples of all of the descriptors in samples of their writing.

How to support your child

It is essential that your child attends school every day. Each morning of the SATs we will be running a breakfast club for Year 6 pupils starting at 8.10am to help prepare and relax the children.







The weekend before the tests, please support your child to relax. Make sure that they have an early night and feel fully rested for the week ahead.

The SATs are a snapshot of what your child has learnt in primary school and the results depend on how well they perform on the day. As the teachers that work with your children, we can honestly say that each and every child has made fantastic progress this academic year. We are proud of the hard work and resilience they have shown in preparing for the tests. In addition to the SATS results, secondary schools also receive our teacher assessments for reading, writing and maths and discuss in detail your child's strengths and interests with our teachers to support your child's transition to secondary school.
