

Sculpture Garden

Please can we remind parents that the area around the sculpture at the front of the school is currently out of bounds whilst the grass continues to grow. Mrs Ware has worked very hard getting it to grow over the very hot summer, it would be a shame for this success to be lost.

Changes to Wraparound Care Prices

We have reviewed the cost of our wraparound care provision and from this term, prices per session for school age children will be as follows:

Breakfast Club: £3.50

1 Hour TASC (3.10-4.10pm): £3.50

Long TASC (3.10-6.00pm): £7.50

Children attending Long TASC will need to bring a snack or light tea with them. Please continue to book sessions on ParentPay at least 48 hours in advance. Please note there are separate prices for Nursery age children, but anyone wishing to book wraparound care for a Nursery child needs to apply in writing to Mrs Parsons (via the school office).

School Lunches

We have a new lunch management system in place, which means it is more important than ever that parents book their child in for a school lunch. This must be done by Friday midday for the following week. If you do not have a ParentPay login, or are having trouble accessing it, please let the school office know.

Cash-free School

A reminder that Trinity is a cash-free school. We cannot accept cash payment for lunches, trips, wraparound care or anything else. The only time cash is permitted in school is for fundraising events and for the tuck trolley. If you need to pay for

something and cannot access ParentPay, please ask the school office for a barcode letter which will allow you to pay at a PayPoint shop location.

Data Collection forms

These will be coming home via children (Y1-Y6). Please check the details we hold on file for your child/ren (including contact details for yourself and any other family members listed), amend if necessary, SIGN THE BACK OF THE FORM and return to the school office as soon as possible. It is a requirement that we ask you to do this at the start of each school year and I would like all forms back in school by the end of September. Many thanks.

Car Park

If you have not already made an application for this school year in order to use the car park (either with a blue disabled badge or by agreement with Mrs Parsons), please do so. We have extremely limited space for disabled parking and it increases the risk to children the more vehicles we have accessing the car park. Access with a current blue badge is only permitted when the person the badge relates to is in the vehicle. If you are able to, please park on the hill and walk through the pedestrian gate. There is no access to anyone at the end of the day without either a blue badge or a current arrangement having been agreed with Mrs Parsons.

CCTV

Please note that CCTV is in operation on the school site 24 hours a day, for the purposes of security and safety.

Communication

It is extremely important that all parents have access to SchoolPing. This is how we communicate all events, letters, announcements, clubs information and many other things you need to be aware of. If you do not have your SchoolPing account activated, please see the school office.

Friendship

At Trinity Church School, we believe it is important to develop core values by which to live and which help to develop a moral and spiritual awareness. We seek to explore the meanings of the core values and their significance through weekly acts of worship delivered by our School Chaplain Mr Parr and Mrs Parsons. The gifts of compassion, trust, creativity, respect, friendship and courage are the values we want our children to leave with. Whilst these gifts are inclusive of human values, we try to anchor them into the Christian faith by relating them to the Bible through stories and readings.

The Christian Value we are particularly focusing on this term is Friendship. True friendship enables each person to grow and ensures that the unique individuality of each person is recognised. Christians believe that God's friendship towards us will last forever. Friendship is a partnership of shared experiences, talents, interests and enthusiasms. In school we will be thinking about how we can be friends to others and how we receive another's friendship, including God's friendship.

We will be linking Friendship to the stories of 'Jesus heals a paralysed man' (Luke 5), 'The story of Jonathan and David' (1 Samuel 18-20) and 'The story of Ruth and Naomi' (Book of Ruth)

What does The Bible tell us about our value for this term?

The Bible tells us that Christians believe they can call God their friend because of the relationship made possible through Jesus.

'You are better off having a friend than being all alone... If you fall, your friend can help you up. But if you fall without having a friend nearby, you are really in trouble' (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10).

At Trinity Church School:

- We support and encourage friendships by providing opportunities for our children to work co-operatively and collaboratively in pairs and in groups
- We find ways to support and include children who might be left out of friendship groups
- We help our children to restore broken friendships and promote forgiveness and resolution
- We help our children to know where they might receive advice and support if they need it
