It's been a great start to term and there's definitely lots more interesting learning to come in Year 3 this year!

Class News:



What a fantastic start to Year 4 it has been for Bees class! The children have settled into their new year group so well and it has been a real pleasure getting to know them. They have already shown such enthusiasm, curiosity and a wonderful attitude towards their learning.

What a wonderful start it has been to the new school year! We are up and running and our new cohort of Lions have settled so brilliantly into life in the Year 5 classroom, representing our class superbly well in terms of their positive attitudes to learning and their exceptional behaviour.

At St Mary's, we always choose to behave in ways which show how important we feel it is to celebrate difference and this very much helped to demonstrate this.

What a fantastic start to the year for Eagles Class. Although we are a small class, we are focused on setting the highest expectations for ourselves and others, setting nothing but the best example. With that said, Eagles have taken to the extra responsibilities that come with being Year 6 pupils, such as being buddies for our Reception pupils, taking on roles as House Point Captains, English Ambassadors and acting as representatives for pupil leadership.

We have started the term with our first Forest School session. Eagles teamed up with Rabbits Class to remind themselves of the rules of the forest, having the opportunity to toast marshmallows, play in the mud kitchen and complete an autumnal colour walk. Eagles were a great example of how we

learn safely in the forest, setting a wonderful example for our Year 1 pupils.

In Writing and Reading, we have been focusing on a text called *Warrior Boy* by Virginia Clay. This text links perfectly to our Geography topic: Kenya. Eagles have enjoyed reading the first five chapters of the book, understanding the characters and linking their geographical knowledge to the narrative. Next week, Eagles will be publishing their first piece of writing focused on character descriptions of the main character, Ben. They will be using hyphenated words, relative clauses and noun phrases to build imagery in the reader's mind.

We are excited to share all of our learning in our Class Assembly in Week 6 of this term.

Free School Meal Changes for the 2026 to 2027 Academic Year

Many families will become eligible for the first time under the expanded FSM Criteria which is changing from September to the following:

Targeted FSM, which continues to be based on the existing threshold, covering pupils who are in households in receipt of Universal Credit with annual household earnings of £7,400 or less

Expanded FSM, a new category covering pupils who do not qualify for targeted FSM, but who are in households receiving Universal Credit with annual household earning of £7,400 & above

School Uniform Reminder

Here's a reminder of the school uniform for anyone needing to purchase new items over the summer break.

Winter Uniform	Navy blue, grey trousers Navy blue, grey skirts or pinafore dresses Light blue polo shirts Navy blue jumper or cardigan with or without the school logo embroidered on it Navy, grey, black or white socks Navy, grey, black tights Shoes should be plain black low heeled or flat and sturdy for outdoor play. An appropriate school coat for all weathers
Summer Uniform	Navy blue, grey or black tailored shorts Blue and white checked / striped dresses
PE Kit To be kept in school at all times in a PE Bag	Plain white T-Shirt with no logo Navy blue or black shorts Plain black daps or trainers
Additional options	Wellington boots, any colour

Staple items such as trousers, tops and plain jumpers can be purchased anywhere. However, if you wish to have items with our logo embroidered on, then you will need to purchase these online from Mapac.

Parents can view all available products by visiting the company's website. There is a separate sheet in the pack explaining how to register with Mapac.

The school does not purchase any items of uniform or keep items here. From time to time, the PTA sell "pre-loved" items of uniform. Pre loved items are also available at Timsbury Library for a small donation.

We are keen to encourage independence and responsibility. Your child is responsible for his/her belongings and the school cannot be held responsible for any losses. We discourage children from bringing personal/valuable belongings into school; this avoids things being lost or broken.

Please help us by ensuring that ALL items of clothing are clearly marked with your child's name. We require all children to have a full PE Kit in school at all times, clearly labelled and in an appropriate bag.

Hairstyles

Long hair should always be tied back, particularly during PE. Children should not be sent to school with extreme haircuts or hairstyles. Hair bands must be white/black or blue, and fashion accessories including large bows are not acceptable.

Shoes and accessories

Shoes should be smart black school shoes and appropriate for school. Black trainers should not be worn as shoes. For safety reasons, children must not wear shoes with an excessively high heel to school or trousers with an excessive flare. Equally, only stud earrings are allowed and children should wear no other jewellery. All earrings must be removed before PE. Nail polish is not permitted at school.

A Reminder About Safeguarding

We are committed to keeping every child safe and supported. If you ever have questions or concerns regarding the safety and wellbeing of any of our pupils, please reach out to the school office.

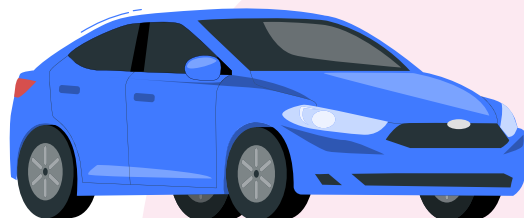
- **A Bright Start:** A quick morning walk wakes up young minds, boosting concentration, energy and mood well before the first bell.

Keeping Our School Community Safe

We understand that driving is sometimes unavoidable. If you do need to bring the car, please help us keep the roads around our school safe, accessible and respectful for our pupils and neighbors:

- **Keep Driveways & Dropped Kerbs Clear:** Please avoid parking across residential driveways or dropped kerbs. Dropped kerbs are essential for parents with buggies, wheelchair users and children who need a safe place to cross.
- **Respect Disabled Bays:** Accessible parking spaces are strictly reserved for drivers displaying a valid Blue Badge. Please leave these free for families who genuinely rely on them.
- **Try "Park & Stride":** If you drive, consider parking a 5 - or 10 - minute walk away from the school gates and walking the remaining distance. It cuts down congestion right outside the entrance and lets you squeeze in a few extra steps!

Thought of the Week

“Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?” Jesus replied: “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.’ This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: ‘Love your neighbour as yourself.’” (Matthew 22: 36-39)



At the start of a brand new school year, it seems appropriate to review some of the values that we all hold dear to us. Lots of schools have values that embody their vision and ethos. Some examples are love, hope, forgiveness, perseverance and courage.

Although not a typical Christian value, responsibility is linked closely with justice and hope. If we are responsible citizens, we will desire and seek justice for our community and our world and we can then have hope that things will get better. Today's verse is all about being responsible.

When Jesus was asked what the greatest commandment was, he replied by giving two commandments. The reason for this is because they are of equal importance and they are so interconnected that it was impossible for Jesus to separate them.

In the Old Testament, the Jewish law, there are a total of 613 commandments. That's quite a few, so when Jesus was asked this question, maybe the 'expert in the law' was hoping to whittle these 613 laws down to just one. What is wonderful about Jesus' response is that if anyone follows and keeps just the two laws he mentions - love God and love others - then they would fulfil all the other 611 laws. If you fully love God and fully love other people, you won't break any of the other commandments.

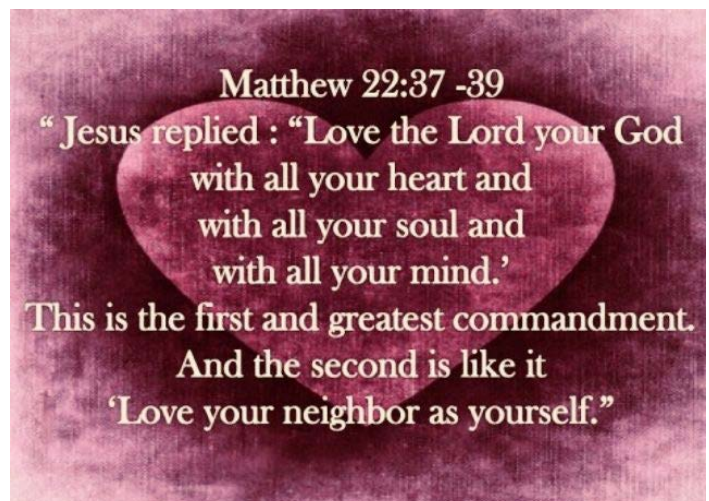
For many of us, the first commandment may be difficult. What if I don't have my own faith and don't believe in God? Well not fulfilling the first commandment doesn't mean you can forget about the other one. If we are all called to be responsible citizens, this means we should be looking out for our fellow man and our planet.

This might mean taking care of a loved one, or maybe giving to a charity that matters to us. Maybe there is something wrong that you feel needs to be put right, something you are seeking justice for. We all have a responsibility to do something to make a difference.

Often, taking action and doing what we can to help others can be very rewarding - not only will those you help flourish but you will too!

So this week, see what it is that you are passionate about. Somewhere that you know you could make a difference. It may only be small, but it could make a

difference in someone's life. And remember, be grateful that we're only asked to follow two commandments and not 613!
