Covid Update

We thought it would be useful to keep you updated each week on any developments at school regarding Covid.

We currently only have one positive case of Covid within the school (a staff member who tested positive this week) and therefore no extra restrictions need to be put in place at the moment. Staff are now wearing masks in communal indoor areas of the school. We also have CO2 monitors in the classrooms to help us decide when extra ventilation is needed and to find a happy balance between ventilation and temperature.
