The energy was electric as they learned about honey production and discovered just how much of the food on our plates depends on our fuzzy, winged friends.

The Nest Project has a specific need for the following items:

- **Bath Care:** Baby or children's shampoo and body wash.
- **Dental Care:** Children's toothpaste and toothbrushes (ages 0-5).
- **Nappy Changing:** Nappies (sizes 3-7), sensitive baby wipes, and nappy cream/Sudocrem.

Class News:

It's been a busy end of term with a lot of fun happening in Foxes. In Science, we have been learning about animals including humans and concluded the topic with a parent workshop where we made a "bionic" hand. The hand was designed to move like a real hand with straws, tape and string showing how bones, joints and tendons work together to help us move. Huge thanks to all the parents who came along and helped us with this project.

In English, we have enjoyed writing instructions on how to make a magical potion. This has required the use of a range of grammar features and the Foxes have come up with some weird and wonderful concoctions!

In Maths, we took our learning outside and learnt how to read and plot co-ordinates on a grid

and also had a go at orienteering. Using our map reading skills, the Foxes had to locate various cards placed around the Forest School area and then work in teams to successfully complete a series of Maths challenges. The contest was extremely close with only a few points between the teams.

Finally, in Music, we have been learning about Jazz music and had to compose a Jazz motif to the tune "Oh When the Saints go Marching in." A motif is a short snippet of music that repeats throughout the tune. We then performed our compositions in front of each other using a glockenspiel.

Class News:

We have really enjoyed the final couple of weeks of Term 5, during which there have been a range of different activities which have provided much fun.

This has particularly been the case in our Music lessons where we have been learning all about looping and remixing. A remix is a new version of an existing piece of music that has been altered with effects. We investigated how this had been done by a composer who had turned Beethoven into 'Beethoven' by using remixing techniques such as looping, adding drums and changing the tempo. We learnt how to play 'Somewhere Over The Rainbow' on the glockenspiels before creating our own remixes of this song by repeating fragments and playing these loops over a backbeat. We have also really enjoyed using Music Lab Song Maker to create remixes on the computer.

In PE this term, we have been developing our football skills. In particular, we have been focussing on sending and receiving under pressure, moving into space and applying defending tactics as a team. It is always great to take full advantage of our wonderful school field - and some lovely sunny weather too! We also had a visiting Sports Coach who worked with us on our athletics skills. We had a lot of fun developing a range of skills involving running, jumping and throwing.

As we head towards Term 6, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the parents and carers for their support when preparing for SATs. The hard work is not over yet, but we certainly have a lot to look forward to!

Thought of the Week

'Later, Levi held a banquet in his home with Jesus as the guest of honour. Many of Levi's fellow tax collectors and other guests also ate with them.' (Luke 5:29)



In our society, we often place a lot of value on celebrating. Sometimes this is for something of real importance - a birthday, a wedding, the birth of a child. Sometimes the celebration isn't for any great event - celebrating a sunny day, reaching the end of the working week, sometimes getting to the end of a difficult day!

There are several examples of celebration in the Bible. In the Old

Testament, there were seven annual festivals which after the Jews went into exile increased to ten. Every week, Jews would also celebrate the Sabbath by having a special meal on Friday evening and many Jews still celebrate Shabbat to this day.

As we move into the New Testament, these festivals were still marked and celebrated - many of these Jesus celebrated himself. But there are also other examples of Jesus celebrating. When Matthew (Levi) decided to follow Jesus, he was invited to eat with Matthew and his friends. When Zacchaeus changed his ways and decided to pay back the people he had cheated, Jesus invited himself to eat at his house. Jesus and his disciples also famously attended a wedding in Cana and he even helped out with the wine! In the parable of the Prodigal Son, the father throws a massive party when his son finally returns.

Many of us have an extra day to enjoy this weekend. This doesn't happen very often in our country so it is worth taking the opportunity to celebrate. One of the main reasons we have this bank holiday at the end of May is because of Whit Monday, a traditional Christian holiday celebrating Pentecost which was supposed to happen 50 days after Easter. Because the date kept changing, the government decided to fix it as the last Monday in May in 1971.

But the end of May also marks the beginning of Summer and it's usually the time when the weather improves and we can enjoy being outside more.

Whatever the reason, let's take the opportunity, if we can, to enjoy an extra day and see it as a reason to celebrate - celebrate family, celebrate summer, celebrate life.
