Maths Week

Maths Week kicked off on Monday with a visit from the Trust's Maths Lead. She observed the wonderful maths taking place in every classroom and officially launched our inter-school **Doodlemaths competition**. She was extremely impressed with the calm learning environments and the opportunities children had to discuss their mathematical learning.

Doodlemaths Competition Update: There was lots of movement on the leader board this week, with our Key Stage 2 learners holding the top spot at one point, and Key Stage 1 in a close second! The final results are currently being collated and will be announced and rewarded next week.

Parent Workshop Success: On Wednesday evening, parents learned more about how Doodlemaths supports home practice. A key takeaway was the fascinating fact that "earning just 7 stars a day resulted in an average increase of 1.3 Doodleage a year." Parents also had the chance to ask our Doodlemaths advisor individual questions.

Parents Maths Morning (Thursday): This busy day included a meeting focusing on the concrete, pictorial and abstract (CPA) strategies we use to build mathematical understanding. Parents then had the valuable opportunity to work alongside their children in the classroom on 'real life' maths problems.

Thursday ended with a wonderful event led by our fantastic FoLS—the **Family Bingo Night!** We were thrilled with the turnout. It was a lot of fun, with some greatly appreciated prizes. A massive thank you to the entire team behind the scenes for putting this brilliant event together!

Speedwatch

We were delighted to welcome Martin and his community team into our school on Thursday. The team delivered an assembly explaining what Speedwatch is and why it is vital in our village. We were all amazed (teachers included!) to learn that the safe stopping distance for a car travelling at 30 mph is longer than our entire school hall! We took the rope out onto the playground for a visual demonstration—hopefully, you saw it at pick-up; it really makes you think.

Today, our older children in **Swallows and Goldfinches** supported Martin and the team on a live Speedwatch duty. They learned to operate the machinery and recorded findings, including noting number plates of relevant vehicles (especially lorries restricted from driving through our village).

News from the Classrooms



In Robins this week we are continuing our theme of people who help us. We have been practicing our writing skills in our Police station and outside we have been putting out fires in our fire engines.





This week, the Kingfishers worked hard in geography to complete their maps of the playground. We also finished our DT unit, where we created wonderful windmills. Our story of the week was *The Dragon Who Swallowed a Knight*, and the children all came up with ideas for how to teach the mischievous dragon a lesson.





The children in Year 3 Starlings have come across some really tricky maths in this unit on Addition & Subtraction. Many new concepts are introduced with larger numbers so we have gone back to concrete apparatus to help us understand the maths taking place. The children have used place value charts and place value counters to work out calculations such as 356 - 179 = ? Well done Year 3, keep up the good work.





This week, Goldfinch class enjoyed a little festive treat where they made Christmas decorations or lanterns. First they drew their design and planned what they would need to make and decorate it, then they used a range of tools and techniques to make their decorations come to life. We all had a good sing along too, to get us all in the mood!





This week, Swallows class have been working hard on their Design & Technology project this half term, which is to design and make a textile tote bag. They have made a paper pattern, have cut out their pieces of fabric, and are now starting to sew them together. The children will then create a design for their bag and then use applique to add and personalise their bags. I'm sure we're going to have some excellent results when we finish them!
