News from the Classrooms

This week in Robins we have been celebrating birthdays, talking about how old we are and which month our birthday is in. We have designed some very yummy cakes and also made party puddings with cream (also known as shaving foam!) and sprinkles. It turned out to be guite a messy tea!

This week Kingfishers learned the days of the week and how to spell them. They also wrote their own story books using their imagination and a single square of paper that they transformed into a window, a mountain, a river, a bridge, a park, a flower bed and a fountain.

We also continue to discover facts about our body and this week we learned about taste buds and healthy eating habits.

This week Starlings have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes. We have been discussing their properties, so far counting 2D shapes, sides and vertices. We have also carried out a few investigations like this one pictured - What shapes can you make out of 15 lolly pop sticks?

This week in science we have been learning about sound and how it travels. Today we did an investigation to see how sound travels through different mediums. Our three mediums were, water (liquid), air (gas) and a table (solid). Why not ask your child which medium does sound travel fastest through.

This week Swallows took part in a writing webinar themed around the World Cup. The webinar hosted almost 500 schools and got us to really think about our vocabulary and sentence structure. Some of the brilliant sentences written by children were:
