**Class News:** 

Wow - where has that term gone?

In Science, we have enjoyed using Microbits as digital thermometers to investigate the difference in temperature for different surfaces in our playground. This nicely linked together a scientific experiment with gathering statistics. The children then turned their data into graphs and analysed the results.

In DT we made sling shot cars. The children had to think carefully about how to make a mechanism with moving parts, how to create a net for the body of their car and how to design it so that it was as aero dynamic as possible. There were some fabulous eye-catching designs and the attention to detail on show was extremely impressive.

We finished our History topic about the Romans with a great parent and carers workshop where we made Roman shields, thinking about the emblems to put on them so that they truly reflected the shields the Romans would have used 2,000 years ago.

Finally, an absolute highlight of the term was seeing the children perform in **Dance Umbrella** on stage at The Forum. Every single one of the class performed the dance confidently and the whole performance was a joy to watch. They certainly received a huge round of applause at the end!

Well done Lions, you've been absolute superstars this term! Have a well deserved rest over Easter.

Year 5 Mini Police have had a fantastic two weeks spreading awareness about the dangers of parking on the yellow zigzag lines in front of the school. The children's enthusiasm has been absolutely brilliant, well done to all of you for making it to school early each day to do this. The support from parents and members of the public has been overwhelming. Well done Mini Police!

In Art, we have been exploring abstract and expressive forms of art through the lens of the Mayans. We have been experimenting with using different tools to paint with besides a paintbrush, such as leaves, sticks, pipe cleaners and pipettes. The children have also been investigating different ways of expressing their own personalities through symbolic images and Mayan 'Wayob'.

We finished our hockey sessions in PE with a mini tournament, where we were able to demonstrate our progress by thinking about all of the key skills we have been working on this term, including finding space, block tackling and reversing the stick so that we are only ever using the flat side.

#### **Head lice**



It's that time of year again when we have more cases of headlice in school. Please check your child's hair and treat them if necessary! Your careful attention to this ongoing problem would be greatly appreciated. Thank you.
