### Rosie the School Dog

Rosie had her much postponed second school dog assessment. I am really pleased to announce that Rosie passed but with some caveats. Ali Scott, the animal behaviourist, explained that Rosie is such a lovely dog I need to be careful that I do not take advantage of her good nature and mistake her coping with activities with her enjoying activities. Rosie's time in school will be limited to a maximum of three mornings in school each week to ensure she gets sufficient rest. She will continue to work closely with a limited number of children. All other children will continue to see her in school when, for example, we pop into class to say a quiet good morning each day. Ali did advise that I avoid greeting families as they come in in the morning together with Rosie, however. I know that Rosie has a few fans amongst our parents and carers so I am sorry to break this news!

#### Maintaining social distancing

I would like to thank you all for supporting the school with our COVID safety measures. I have had to remind a few parents and carers about the need to maintain social distancing. As you may be aware, the risk of all children returning to school is less about children themselves being back in school but the associated increase in social interactions - particularly amongst adults and how that might contribute to a rise in transmission rates. We are constantly trying to find the appropriate balance between safety measures and the smooth running of the school. I am eager to avoid measures such as one way systems for drop off and collections which I think would be very difficult to make work on our site without massive disruption so I would ask all parents to continue to maintain that distance between themselves. I know it is hard! Thank you for your understanding.
