### Class News:

We have had a wonderful couple of weeks back at nursery. The children have been enjoying reading *'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'* by Eric Carle which has led to lots of fun activities including apple painting, drawing, story maps, crafting and more. Some of the children enjoyed making a fruit salad with the fruit the Hungry Caterpillar eats in the story. They cut the fruit themselves talking about which part of the fruit we can eat and what foods we enjoy eating. The children then enjoyed eating the fruit salad they had made all by themselves, some of the children even enjoyed trying a new fruit for the first time. Lots of the children can now recite the story of *'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'* off by heart and remember exactly what happens.

We are currently focusing on sprucing up our outside area and some resources have arrived which we have enjoyed playing with including some balance beams. ## Class News:

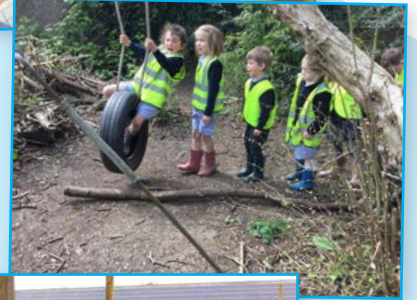
Wow, what a great start to the term, the children are enjoying their learning of our *new growth and life cycle topic*. We have got a delivery of soil coming soon which we can't wait to use to plant a range of new plants and seeds. We've been writing about plants this week. Labelling the different parts and writing about what plants need to grow. The children are becoming proficient at remembering finger spaces and full stops! We have enjoyed reading "*The Tiny Seed*" by Eric Carle and have shared lots of non-fiction texts about plants and flowers.

Our phonics lessons have also progressed this term. We are consolidating the sounds we have learnt so far and using this knowledge to write longer words, with 2 constants next to each other. Eg lift.

In Mathematics, we are counting to 20 and beyond. We have been ordering 2 digit teen numbers and have been using the bead strings and number lines to help us. We are beginning to add 2 quantities together and are remembering to use all of our practical resources to help us.

In PE, we have a new topic of *ball skills*. We have enjoyed being different insects, whilst rolling, stopping, intercepting and aiming the balls.

# Rabbits



## Class News:

What a great start to Term 5 it has been in Rabbit Class. With the weather warming up now, Rabbit Class has enjoyed doing more learning outside.

In English, we are going to be writing about the story '*Jack and the Beanstalk*'. Rabbit Class are really enjoying learning about this book so far. They have especially enjoyed role playing as Jack and getting to answer questions about the story.

In Maths, we have started our new unit on *place value to 100*. So far, we have been exploring counting, sequencing and partitioning numbers up to 100 so far.

In Art, we are creating *3D paper sculptures*. We have learned different techniques to shape paper into 3D structures, such as, rolling, folding, curling, bending and twisting. We have been thinking carefully about the colours we are using to make our sculptures stand out.

Finally, we are learning all about moving robots in Computing. Year 1 are finding this topic very exciting and are having lots of fun using Beebots. We have been exploring how robots need commands to move.

# Badgers



## Class News:

Term 5 has started with great enthusiasm in Badger Class. On the first day back I was astounded at how quietly the children came into school. They are well settled into their routines and got straight to work solving our morning Maths quadrant quiz!

We are loving Maths this term! We have started our new unit on *Fractions*. We are exploring halves, quarters and thirds, making them with concrete resources and finding fractions of amounts. The children have a good understanding that fractions are made of equal parts but are finding it a bit more challenging to remember that the denominator shows the total amount of parts and the numerator shows how many of these parts are shaded (when comparing to pictures). We will get there though and we're enjoying investigating along the way.

Our new writing unit is based on *'Emily Brown and the Thing'*. We learnt lots about the importance of sleep in our 'hook' lesson and did a quiz to find out what

type of animals we are based on our sleep habits. I don't think you will be surprised to know that most children enjoy going to bed late!

Our class read at the moment is *'Oliver and the Seawigs'*. The children are really enjoying this much more challenging book and are starting to get some of the more grown up humour. They find the sarcastic sea particularly funny.

In DT we are learning about balanced diets. This leads on well from our PSHE work last term on 'Healthy Me'. The children can remember the 5 main food groups and their understanding of what types of food are in each group is steadily improving too. They enjoyed designing a menu with 3 balanced meals this week and taking orders from the class as if we were in a restaurant.

# Foxes



## Class News:

What a wonderful start to Term 5. The children have returned to school full of enthusiasm for the term ahead.

In Maths, we have been learning about fractions. The children have become confident describing the denominator and numerator in fractions. They have been able to order fractions based on their knowledge.

During English lessons, we have finished *'The Firework-Maker's Daughter'* by Phillip Pullman.

We have been learning how to write descriptive sentences and persuasive techniques to persuade our readers to join us at the magnificent firework display near the end of the book. The children have been developing their vocabulary and have impressed me with their imagination.

In Science, we have been thinking about the parts of a flowering plant and what the job each one does. The children have been using key scientific vocabulary such as absorb and transport in their explanations.

We have been learning how to track a ball in our PE lessons and keep control of it by dribbling with our feet or our hands. The children have persevered and really challenged themselves - well done.

We have started our new unit of learning in Music by learning *how to play the djembe* with a flat hand to make a base sound. We enjoyed playing a game where we copied a rhythm and we all had a go at starting a new rhythm for everyone else to copy.

## Class News:

Lion Class have had a great start to the new term. We are enjoying being outside in PE, and our focus this term is on *ball skills*. We have had to think about sending and receiving the ball accurately as well as how we move around the space, looking for members of our team.

In English we have started our new text *"Who Let The Gods Out."* This book is full of complex language and the children are enjoying the challenge of using new vocabulary in their writing. In Science, we have been learning about our teeth as part of our *Animals Including Humans* topic, including making detailed observations of our own teeth. Do you know the names of all of the types of teeth we have? The Lions certainly do!

In Geography, we have put our research skills to the test by comparing two locations within the USA. The children worked really hard looking at a variety of different information sources in order to pull out some key facts about their chosen locations.

Finally, the children continue to impress me with their approach to learning their times tables, improving both their speed of recall and accuracy. Times tables are vitally important to so many areas of Maths and are a big focus in Year 4. Your support in helping your child learn their times tables is really appreciated.

## Class News:

Last week, the Year 5 Eagles had the fabulous opportunity to visit the Royal Bath and West Show Grounds for the **Field to Food Learning Day**.

They represented the school admirably, both on the coach and during the event. Their involvement and enthusiasm in the demonstrations and activities was superb!

During the day we participated in several activities aimed at spreading awareness and knowledge of the process which our food takes on its journey from the farm to our plates. The children had the opportunity to meet several farm animals, including sheep, pigs, and cows. Children learned about their life cycles and their lives on the farm, such as the food they eat and how it is made, and sheep shearing.

We also had the opportunity to learn about the more computerised aspect of farming, with children having the opportunity to explore a brand new self-driven tractor, interact with computer programming, and build their own solar panelled circuits.

To end our day, we learnt about the dairy and ice cream industry, and even tried some very special 80% dairy ice cream from Purbeck!

## Christian Value

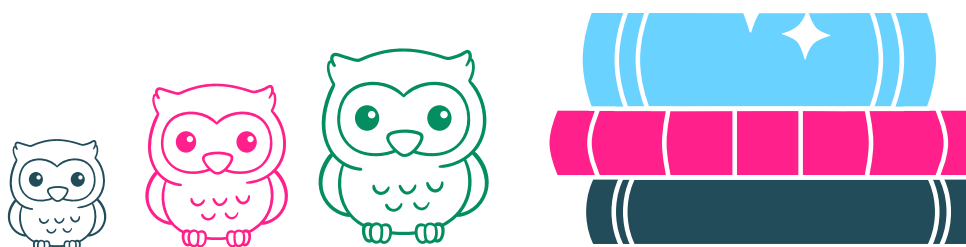
