With this part of the Christmas story, I am reminded again that God didn't send the angels to tell King Herod or the important leaders or the chief priests about the birth of the Messiah, the angels were sent to tell shepherds. These would have been very poor men who were shunned by society. People saw them as the lowest of the low and they were considered as unclean because of the work they did. They spent all their time with dirty smelly sheep, their manure, their blood from cuts and scrapes and the insects that buzzed around them. They were never considered clean enough to worship with God's people and were generally treated as outsiders.

What a wonderful thing it is that God saw them as worthy and welcomed them to come and witness the birth of Jesus. Jesus went on in his lifetime to specialise in welcoming people who were considered as unclean and unwelcomed by others. Those who were ignored and ostracised were now included and accepted.

What a message this is. For Christians around the world, they know that whoever they are and whatever they've done, God sent Jesus to be born and later to be crucified, to take their place in dying for the wrong things they have done and continue to do. It now means everyone is welcome to spend their life reconciled with him.

Surely the idea that everyone, no matter what, is welcomed and accepted is the true meaning of Christmas?
