### **Class News:**

Well done Ducklings, what a fantastic term we are having! Our topic of *Growth* and *Life Cycles* has been wonderful so far.

In Literacy, the children have been reading the story of 'The Tiny Seed' by Eric Carle. We have been exploring the signs of Spring, planting seeds, labelling parts of a plant and learning about life cycles. The children have loved visiting Forest School and explored their surroundings with enthusiasm.

This week we have introduced the book, 'One Odd Egg' by Emily Gravett and have written explanations about which animal has hatched from the different kinds of eggs.

It has been so very exciting to have real life chicks hatching in an incubator in the classroom. Many thanks to Lisa Horler for planning the hatch. The children have been in awe, witnessing them hatching before their very eyes.

In Maths, we have continued to explore 'how many now?', looking at how quantities change when you add and take away. We have loved creating with 2Ds shapes and the children are looking at rotation and using shapes for a purpose. They have created some wonderful pictures.

I have been planning our summer trip and we are hoping to hold some fundraising activities to keep costs down where possible. More information to follow.

Badgers are so happy to have Forest School back on a Thursday afternoon, and had a brilliant time last week building their own nests. Badgers are also enjoying their cricket lessons on Tuesdays.

What a great start it has been to Term 5. It's one of the shorter terms but we are determined to pack a lot in!

We began by getting ready for our educational visit to **Bristol Civil and Family Justice Centre**. We were lucky enough to be given the opportunity to attend a National Justice Museum 'Court In Session' workshop which involved visiting an actual working court building (we all had to go through their strict airport-style security procedures on arrival) and taking part in a 'mock trial'. Our class were allocated roles (Judge, Clerk, Usher, Barrister, Solicitor, Witness or Juror) and then acted out a trial based on real-life events. Our 'mock trial' involved alleged cyberbullying, with the defendant being accused of harassment. It was a really exciting experience and an opportunity to take part in something a bit different. Sadly, there are no photos of this due to the strict rules regarding photography inside court buildings.

Another brilliant event that has taken place this term has been *Bikeability*. It has been great to hear the reports from our cycling instructors about the enthusiasm, positive behaviour and the impressive cycling techniques they have encountered. This has been a super chance for our pupils to

learn about road safety and become more familiar with how to navigate their way safely around the roads of Timsbury.

Our PE sessions in Term 5 have involved sessions working with a Bath Cricket Coach and also developing our map reading skills in weekly orienteering activities. It has been fun to locate the stations within the school grounds and then solve the puzzles we find there.

Fridays in Term 5 have become our 'Creativity Days' where our timetable includes English, Music and Art. Our English activities see us perform to an audience in our Readers' Theatre and also have the opportunity as authors to decide our own genres in Creative Writing. In Music, we have been learning about the origins of blues music and identifying some of the features of this genre. We have become familiar with chords often used in blues music and have begun playing the 12-bar blues on glockenspiels. Finally, our Art work this term is on the theme of *Architecture*. We have drawn houses from observation, interpreting the details to draw accurately, and also planned a print and used the monoprint technique to create an abstract piece.

Although this term has been tough with SATs revision, I have to commend the sheer determination and resilience of our amazing Year 6 pupils. They have been driven to be the best learners they can be, and I am incredibly proud of them.

In Maths, we have completed the final areas of the curriculum, ending on some tricky topics such as algebra and geometry. Eagles have worked hard to solve problems involving expressions, substitution, translation and reflection. It has been wonderful to see their confidence grow and their attitude towards reasoning questions improve—adopting an "I can do it" mindset and tackling every challenge with enthusiasm.

In PE, we were lucky to have a cricket coach come in

and work with us. Eagles are already keen cricketers, but these sessions have helped them develop new skills and techniques, which they have eagerly transferred into their free play at lunchtimes.

In English, we've been brushing up on all our SPaG skills, tackling the areas the children find most challenging. To keep lessons fun and light-hearted, we've played a variety of grammar and punctuation games to help secure their understanding of determiners, types of conjunctions and the passive voice.

On Fridays, Eagles have loved the opportunity to head out into the forest area and help Mr Thomson with the 'Spring Tidy'. They've enjoyed learning how to use tools, and it's been a great chance to revisit some forest school skills.


### Netball



vital work. These everyday essentials can make a huge difference to families struggling to make ends meet.


### The Nest Project is currently in need of the following items:
