Ducklings have had a wonderful start to Term 6. Our new topic is *Animals and their Habitats* and the children have enjoyed mapping out the story of 'The Three Little Pigs'. In Literacy, the children have written speech bubbles for what the wolf would say and have completed some detailed drawings. This week we have read 'Handa's Surprise' and have been summarising the story.

In Maths, we have been exploring positional language and the children had loved making their own treasure maps. We have explored repeated patterns and are getting really good at noticing the unit of repeat. We are consolidating our learning from this year and continue to improve our recognition of teen numbers and number bonds to 10.

Thank you to all that attended the parent clay modelling workshop.

So many creative animal models and lovely to share our home made peppermint creams with you all.

We are excited to have our own Ducklings raised bed and the children have been planting onions, beans, courgettes, strawberries and tomatoes. We can't wait to try them.

We enjoyed a very sporty week with a visit from Timsbury Tigers Football club. The children proudly received their medals and learned some new dribbling and shooting football skills. We had such a wonderful morning at **Sports Day**. The children have loved practising during PE sessions and showed fantastic team work during the morning. Well done Team Timsbury!

Rabbits



Class News:

Rabbits have come into Term 6 ready to learn! I have been really impressed by their hard work and independence.

Over the past few weeks we have been focusing on phonics. We have been revising phase 4 and phase 5. Rabbits have been working incredibly hard to develop their phonetic knowledge and they have really enjoyed our daily phonics carousels with lots of fun phonics activities.

In Maths, we have started our new unit on *place value to 100*. We have been counting from 1 to 100 in 1's and 10's, partitioning into tens and ones and exploring the number line. We have been using resources such as a 100 square, base ten and number lines to support our learning.

In Computing, our new unit is

programming. We have been using 'scratch' to help us create animations. So far, we have explored creating an algorithm using command blocks to make our sprite move. We are looking forward to learning how to change the character, background and the functions of different command blocks.

Finally, we all had a fantastic time at **Sports Day**. We had been practising in our PE lessons ready for **Sports Day** and their practise and determination helped them to earn lots of points for their houses. Rabbits loved all the **Sports Day** activities but most thought the water activity was their favourite. Thank you to everyone who was able to join us!

Welcome to Term 6! As usual, it's been a busy and productive start to the term from our Foxes.

In English, we have been learning how to write poetry in preparation for the **Poetry Slam** event alongside lots of other schools in the Trust. The Foxes rose to the challenge brilliantly and wrote some fantastic poems. Some of the children preferred to write rhyming poems whilst others chose to focus on challenging vocabulary to suggest imagery. We then selected several poems and put them together to create our performance pieces and the children enjoyed performing these to the whole school.

In Music, we have been getting into the carnival spirit and are enjoying learning about Samba rhythms and beats. The children have been outside in the sunshine creating their own samba beats using a variety of different percussion instruments.

In Science, we have been learning about the digestive system and conducted

a fantastic practical experiment to understand exactly what happens to our food when it goes down the oesophagus to the stomach. The class explored the whole of the process from input to output! The Foxes really enjoyed this experiment - ask them what they have learnt!

Finally, we have had some great PE lessons, preparing for **Sports Day** and we also enjoyed taking part in the **Move a Mile day for the NSPCC**. A mile was no problem for the Foxes and there has been a lot of good natured competitiveness in our athletics this term. Throwing the vortex has probably been the highlight so far and we have some extremely skilled athletes in our midst. Class News:

It's astonishing to think that we have reached the final term of this school year. What a brilliantly productive and successful time we have had since September and Term 6 has begun in similarly fine style.

We have begun our new text in English which is 'Rain Player' by David Wiesniewski. This story links with our learning in History where we are studying the Maya civilisation. We have been discussing the features of writing journal entries and will be creating Pik's diary for the time he decided to challenge the gods to a game of pok-a-tok.

Our final topic in Geography is on *Mountains* and we have been learning about three different types of these physical features: fold mountains, volcanic mountains and plateau

We have learned about beam bridges, arch bridges and truss bridges and, as you can see in the photos, we made our own versions of each of these types of bridges and then tested them out to see which could support the most weight. We had a lot of fun making truss bridges out of spaghetti!

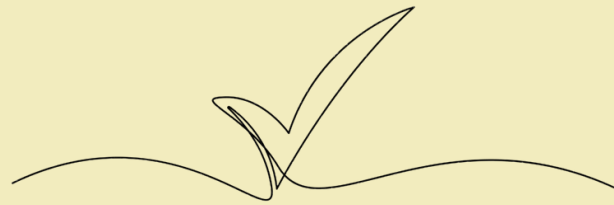
