School Uniform

While the majority of our pupils are coming to school every day in the correct school uniform, a reminder that this also applies to PE days. Children should be wearing a white t-shirt, black or navy joggers or shorts and trainers on these days, as well as a school jumper or cardigan. Thank you for your support with this.

Doodle English

Previously we reminded you that we now have access to DoodleEnglish alongside our DoodleMaths and DoodleTables accounts. The icons (add, times, speech bubble and pencil) allow you to switch between the programmes. This week, the class teachers have reset the children's baselines to ensure that their algorithms are at the correct level for them. Please ensure that if you are working with your children whilst they are doodling at home that you do not answer questions for them as this has an effect on their algorithm. Of course you can support the children through explaining how to work the question out but it is then a good idea to add it to their 'tricky question' so that it gets revisited again in the near future. Keep doodling at home as '*Earning just 7 stars a day results in an average increase of a 1.3 in DoodleAge a year.*' Remember the aim is that each child is in their green zone each week!

Tree Removal

It was only a few weeks ago that some of the staff were discussing the pros and cons of the huge lime tree on our field. As it happened, we then had a tree survey on the Monday after we broke up for Christmas, where they identified a huge split down the middle of the trunk. This meant that the tree needed to be removed urgently and over the last two days a team has come in to cut it down. Many of the children in Kingfisher and Starling classes have been watching this process with much interest out of their classroom window! While this means there will be less shade on the field, it will hopefully allow for better growth for the grass as we enter spring and summer.

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News from the Classrooms




In Robins this week we are talking about Winter. The children have enjoyed playing in the airport role play area and flying the plane to go on their winter holidays to ski in the snow.


