Thank you to everyone who came and helped out on **Sports Day**, your presence was definitely appreciated on the day, particularly by the children in Badgers.



Year 5 go to Wells Cathedral

This term, the Year Five pupils went to Wells Cathedral on a school trip to learn more about Anglo-Saxons.

They were given a guided tour of the Cathedral, saw the famous clock chime at 12pm and also went to visit the Chained Library, which is one of the oldest libraries in the country. They particularly found it interesting to look at some books which were over 200 years old and were written in Latin.

Some of the other activities they did were sketching interesting things that inspired them inside the ancient building and enjoying the large grassy area at the front of the Cathedral for a run around at lunchtime. As their day at the Cathedral was coming to an end, they made their own small, leather-bound books on key chains (mini replicas of the ones they had seen earlier in the day when they visited the Library) which they were able to keep as souvenirs.

Aidan, one of the Year Five pupils, said, "I loved visiting Wells Cathedral because I learnt a lot more about Anglo-Saxons and I would love to go there again."

The staff at Wells Cathedral were delighted with their behaviour and excellent listening during the visit. Hopefully the Year 5 pupils now know even more about the Anglo-Saxons.

We're hosting a special **Volunteers' Brunch**, where some of our Year 6 children will be delighted to serve you a variety of tasty snacks.



If you have any problems or need help to access your account please contact the school office.


A note about safeguarding...


