# **Music Week**





Music week has been a great success, with the children experiencing an eclectic range of musical genres. We have had an action packed week full of music making experiences, as well as a multitude of top quality live performances. Some of the highlights of the week include:

- On Monday Year 2 and Reception both enjoyed workshops with a Senior Lecturer at Bath Spa University, focussing on rhythm and pulse. Reception perfected identifying and repeating the pulse. Year 2 were able to experiment with texture and off-beats. All the children tried a range of new unpitched percussion instruments, with one of the favourites being the bongos!
- On Tuesday Year 2 enjoyed a trip to Downside School, visiting the Abbey and attending an amazing concert put on by the Music Department at Downside. We experienced many different instruments... varying from Double Bass to the Harp! Thank you very much to the team at Downside for making this possible!
- On Wednesday Year 1 and Year 2 attended workshops ran by the Director of Music at Prior Park College. They discussed African music as well as singing technique. Year 1 and Year 2 also attended workshops with a Member of Wells Cathedral Choir, discussing life as a singer and how Christians can worship through music. Some children were even able to try chorister cassocks on! The school day ended with a whole school Singing Assembly joint led by the Director of Music at Prior Park College and the Member of Wells Cathedral Choir. After a performance from the musicians of a movement from Bach's Christmas Oratorio ('Bereite dich Zion'), a movement from Handel's Messiah ('Thou Art Gone Up On High') and the piece 'All of Me' for solo piano by Jon Schmidt, we focussed on a traditional Kenyan song. This culminated in a full school performance of the piece.
- On Thursday 'The Pix' visited us from Norton Hill Secondary School! The rock band played the whole school a full set of groovy tunes that we couldn't help but clap and dance along to. The band gave us demonstrations of their instruments and even let some of us try their microphone! Thank you to Norton Hill Secondary School Music Department and to 'The Pix' for a wonderful afternoon!

#### Car Park Etiquette

Please can EVERYONE including grandparents/aunties/uncles or any adult picking up/dropping off at school please take care when driving around our car park. For the safety of all children and adults using the car park can we please ask that you:

- Check your speed, some vehicles are travelling at speed through our car park.
- Please DO NOT cut through parking bays, follow the one-way system to the exit.
- When you are picking up/dropping your child off at school please switch your engines off.
- Please do not park in the disabled bays unless you hold a blue badge.
- Please do not park in the layby, in front of the main door to school, without prior arrangement.
- Take care when approaching the 2 zebra crossings.

## Year 1 Folly Farm Trip

On Monday Dragonfly and Cricket Class visited Folly Farm. We had a wonderful day exploring, discovering and investigating more about minibeasts both in the woodland and in the pond. During the woodland walk the children had to find different locations and then read the clues at that location to help them find out what minibeast to look out for. At the end of the woodland walk the children had time to discuss what they had found out about each minibeast and how we can look after our woodland and minibeasts. The pond dipping was also a brilliant experience. The children got to use nets to scoop out minibeasts and put them into a tray of water, this then allowed the children to look more closely as the minibeasts who live in water and use identification cards to categories and learn more about what they had found.
