# **Proposed Industrial Action**

As you are probably aware, teachers who are members of the National Education Union (NEU) have recently voted to take strike action. There are four potential dates for schools in this area which have been set as: Wednesday 1st February, Thursday 2nd March, Wednesday 15th March and Thursday 16th March.

There are many members of the NEU among our staff and it looks likely that they will support this action, which therefore may have an impact on the school. A letter was sent from the Trust yesterday in regards to the strike days, explaining how the situation will change from school to school. We are currently working out staff ratios and will email parents by the middle of next week with any changes for February 1st. Our aim will be to keep the school open for as many pupils as possible.
