News from the Classrooms



This week in Robins we've had a lot of fun playing with flour and glitter, finding animals, making shapes and using our imagination, apologies and thanks to the cleaning ladies!



This week we received a wonderful visit from Benji's grandparents John and Jenny Clare, they talked to the children about their childhood and the toys they played with in the 50's.



We have had a super week in our new classroom set up. The children have been amazing and have completed all normal lessons. They actually quite like it!



Goldfinches have been exploring pitch and have made their own pipes using straws. The children discovered that the shorter the straw, the higher the pitch - this is because vibrations cause all the air inside the straw to vibrate, producing a sound. When you cut the straw shorter, the pitch of the sound gets higher. The shorter straw made a sound wave with a higher frequency than the longer straw.



Swallow Class have had a very active week including completing their sponsored run, investigating solubility in Science and setting treasure hunts in Wren Woods. A particular highlight was a hot chocolate treat in the woods!
