Thought of the Week

'But Ruth replied, "Don't urge me to leave you or to turn back from you. Where you go I will go, and where you stay I will stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God." (Ruth 1:16)



Ruth and Naomi - He Qi (2001)

If you don't know the story of Ruth, it is well worth a read. The Vision and Values team are performing it to the rest of the school on Tuesday as an example of faithfulness.

In the story, Naomi, her husband and her two sons leave Judah during a time of famine and set up home in the neighbouring country of Moab. While they are there, both Naomi's sons marry Moabite women, but unfortunately soon after this, Naomi's husband and sons die. We're not told why they die, but Naomi is then left with her two daughters-in-law, who she encourages to stay in Moab so they can marry again, while she returns to Bethlehem in Judah. One of her daughters returns, but Ruth decides to stay with Naomi, telling her she will stick with her whatever happens.

For an elderly widow and her foreign daughter-in-law, returning to Judah isn't easy. Life for widows and single women in those days was difficult without a man and their only means of survival is for Ruth to 'glean' or pick up any grain that is left behind by the harvesters. Ruth chooses a field that is owned by a man called Boaz, who fortunately is a close relative of Naomi and is legally obliged to help

a family member in serious difficulty - like Naomi.

Boaz soon takes a shine to Ruth and after Naomi intervenes and suggests that Ruth 'declares' her love for him too, Boaz proposes. By the end of the book, Naomi, who very early on was left destitute with no family or finances, soon ends up with a supportive family and a grandson in her arms. It is a wonderful story of faithfulness and provision.

What is particularly special about this short book is that Ruth's son turns out to be the grandfather of David, the future model king of Israel.

For many people this story is an example of God's provision. It also demonstrates that when it comes to God, everyone is worthy. Ruth was an immigrant and would have had very different beliefs to the people of Israel. But she changes her faith and devotes herself to God. As a result of this, God blesses her and includes her in the genealogy of not only King David but ultimately Jesus himself.

Christians believe that God is willing to accept everyone regardless of their background or their history, as long as they want him involved in their lives. Ruth is just one of many examples of people who have experienced God's love and acceptance in their lives.
