News from the Classrooms



We have been talking about the jungle and jungle animals this week. We have also been learning about the importance of the rainforest. We had fun exploring the tuff tray with snakes in slimy jelly and chia seed swamp.



We kicked off a fun new topic this week. We're looking at how people played in the past and discovering how toys have changed (or stayed the same) over the years. Our wonderful guest speaker, *Sue Rodford*, shared her childhood experiences with the children and together we made our own spinning tops. Our art sessions have been full of texture lately! We're continuing to experiment with weaving, blending everything from soft wool to strips of paper and rags.



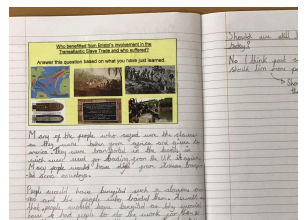
It's that time of year again to get your loose change out (if you have any!) as in Starling class Year 2 are learning about money. Although many of us use very few coins and notes these days, it is a very important skill for the children to understand; the actual value of money. So raid those piggy banks and purses and add up the notes and coins- how much money do you have in them?!



In Science lessons, we have been learning about air resistance. The children made predictions about what would happen if we changed one variable, such as the size of the parachute or the length of the string. They then designed and made their own parachutes and tested them carefully. The children discovered that larger parachutes and longer strings generally fell more slowly, helping them to see how air resistance works in real life. Everyone enjoyed experimenting, observing results and thinking like real scientists!



In History this week, we have been learning about the Transatlantic Slave Trade and its effect on our local city, Bristol, within our overall topic of The Georgians. We learned how the slave trade ran between Britain, Africa and the Americas, and we learned of the terrible hardship that these slaves endured. The children in Swallows wrote some excellent responses to the questions around the slave trade, and we ended up looking at how slavery was brought to an end in Britain and abroad.
