This week in Robins we've been reading *Handa's Surprise* and trying lots of new fruits at snack time. In the book Handa carries a basket of fruit on her head so we tried walking with a basket on our heads, it was very tricky!





In Kingfishers we continued exploring the concepts of height, length and time. The book of the week was *Handa's Surprise*, we learned about the African continent and how people and animals live in different habitats. We completed another phonics assessment and the children should all be very proud of their results.





At the end of our music unit in Starlings we created a performance piece for 'Under the Sea'. We used an image of a diver in the ocean and when our conductor, Mrs Brooks, pointed to the image we had created music for we played our instruments. We had a wonderful time!!





In Goldfinches we had a wonderful time during a visit from Jackdaws. The children were shown all different types of recorders; from very small ones, to enormous ones, bigger than the children. They also had the opportunity to play the violin and they played beautifulfully!
