Dear Parents/ Carers,

Although we only have some of our year groups attending school at the moment, it is beginning to feel almost normal in school so it is time to resurrect regular newsletters to share news and successes rather than stick to what has been a steady diet of purely COVID related communications!

We are currently averaging just over 100 children in school each day. Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 are fully open. Pre-School is open part-time only. We have 66 children of key workers or vulnerable children attending across the week with an average of 40 in any one day.

The children are in 'bubbles' of no more than 15 and have designated areas to play in. In Year 1 and Year 6, we encourage social distancing; in Pre-School and Reception this clearly isn't possible and would be detrimental to the children's well-being so we keep to our bubbles, wash our hands frequently and clean constantly! It felt strange for children and staff initially but we very quickly adapted and, whilst it is not school as 'normal', it is fantastic to see children learning and having fun at play.



Our Year 6 children relax, suitably distanced, in their 'bubble'. Fortunately, the weather has been pretty good - most of the time!

In Reception, our children use their imagination to play collaboratively. It is so good to have at least some of our children back in school.

Induction Transition arrangements

Our usual transition arrangements are unfortunately not possible this year due to the pandemic. The following arrangements have been put in place:

For Pre-School entering Reception:

All primary schools will be closed the last two days of the year to enable us to invite new Reception families in one at a time for a short induction. Even with school being closed, I am afraid we will not be able to have all families visit. We will prioritise families of new pupils and vulnerable pupils. We are also organising a zoom presentation for all parents and sending a video introduction to all families.

For children in Year 6:

The secondary schools are not able to offer their usual transition days. Schools are looking at how they can invite children individually or in small groups. Our children are completing transition units provided by the secondary school humanities departments that will be sent up to their next school

Other children in years:

We will be announcing the new classes next week. Unfortunately, we are unable to run our normal shuffle up events. Phase teams are producing videos to introduce themselves and what children can expect next year which will be sent to all our families.

Needless to say, our staff will be holding extensive information handover meetings to ensure they are aware of each child's needs.
