Wraparound Care

With Breakfast and After School Club already in full swing, we wanted to share with you some of the exciting things we do before and after school. The morning routine starts early at 7:30am, where our friendly Wraparound Team greets the children and offers a variety of breakfast options. We all sit together to enjoy our meal and chat before choosing from a range of activities such as board games, crafts, and colouring. Alternatively, the children can opt to go outside for some exercise or simply relax on the cushions. At 8:30am, it's time to head to the classrooms to start the school day.

After school, we meet in the hall where the Wraparound Team is there to welcome the children. We begin with a snack and the register, followed by an explanation of the evening's schedule. There are two options for after school club, a short one and a long one. For those staying until 6pm, we suggest bringing a packed

dinner as we eat together around 4:30pm and enjoy some friendly conversation. The children are encouraged to make suggestions for activities, and we have a suggestion box available for this purpose. Some of the suggestions we've received so far include Starbucks, a water fight, CAKE (in capital letters), and pass the parcel. While we can't promise to fulfil every suggestion, we always listen and do our best to accommodate.

One of the most exciting things we do each week is guess how many objects are in a jar. The children love this game, and last week, Bea guessed the exact number of crayons in the pot, winning a prize. The karaoke machine has been a huge hit with the children, although we're not sure about singing Christmas songs September! This week we have been reading and retelling the 'Owl Babies' story. We know lots of the story off by heart and have been retelling it using puppets. We have created beautiful night time pictures using oil pastels.

During our Maths sessions, we have been subitising 1,2 and 3. The children used their fast fingers to respond and show their knowledge to the class.

We have been programming the Beebots and are learning how to make them move in different direction. This has supported our work based on 'My map book'.

Finally, our Excellence Exhibition was a great way to show off all of our hard work throughout our *Austin's Butterfly Project*. Year 1 were very proud of their work and were very excited to share this with their families.

We are enjoying our 'Street Detectives' unit in Geography and are getting really good at using grid references to locate different features on a map. We understand that a map is a picture of an area and often has symbols to represent places.

Finally, we had a super time on our first trip of the year to the Guildhall for our writing workshop. The Badgers represented the school brilliantly and were model pupils.
