



The new King and the world's longest queue!

The UK has a new monarch, following the death of her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. From now on the Queen's eldest son will be known as King Charles III. His wife, Camilla, becomes the Queen Consort, which is a term used to describe the partner of the King.

Prior to her funeral, the Queen's coffin was taken to Parliament's Westminster Hall where tens of thousands of people queued to pay their respects. The queue reached about 5 miles long with wait times of up to 16 hours.

Cedar Class




Class News:

Class News:



It has been a busy two weeks in Willow Class. In Maths this week, we have continued our topic on *place value* - we have been learning how to partition two and three digit numbers and representing numbers up to 1,000 using base tens.

The children have completed some incredible sentences based on our book "*The Flood*". For the past two weeks, we have been reading the story and coming up with different verbs, adjectives, and adverbial phrases to add depth to our writing. They have worked incredibly hard in English and should all be very proud of themselves!

In Geography, the children were introduced to volcanoes. We learned how they are formed and investigated the eruption of Pompeii. The children showed fascination in this specific case-study and were asking some amazing questions!

Last Tuesday, we celebrated Roald Dahl Day. We spent our afternoon reading "*The Twits*" and everyone created hilarious paper beards to represent Mr Twit.

Finally, in Art, we continued exploring peer feedback in regards to improving our sketches. To each sketch the children have applied their individual improvements and have created some beautiful rose sketches - well done Willow Class, another fantastic two weeks!

Class News:



In English, we have continued to be inspired by the legend of *Romulus* and *Remus* and the foundation of Rome. At the end of this week the children had a chance to put their learning into their own piece of writing during a free writing session based around a story starter which they thoroughly enjoyed. We will be sharing them via Seesaw!

Place value continues to be our focus in Maths. This week, we have enjoyed exploring flexible (non-standard) partitioning and finding 1, 10, 100 or 1000 more or less. We have used dienes and place value counters as resources to help develop our understanding of these concepts.

As well as swimming (including a 4 mile round walk), the children have also been keeping active in PE sessions with handball. We are having a lot of fun learning the skills and the game together.

The children have absolutely loved our first two lessons on *electrical circuits*. They have been making predictions and testing different circuits to discover more about electricity and features of working circuits.

Redwood Class


In Redwood Class, we have enjoyed participating in various activities for Roald Dahl day, including creating fact files and producing art work in the style of Quentin Blake.

Ice Cream Sundaes!

On Thursday 6th October, we are bringing back our ever-popular Ice Cream Sundaes! We cannot change the menu on the new system, so please look out for a SchoolPing to book your child in for a school lunch on that day if you would like them to have a sundae. If they would like to bring in a packed lunch instead of having the main course, please specify this on the form. The cost for paying children will be £2.60, regardless of whether they have one or two courses.

IMPORTANT: School Lunches

It has become clear since the new lunch booking system has been in place that many parents are not pre-booking their child's meals. As a result, our kitchen is currently producing between 30-40 meals a day on top of the numbers they expected - this is happening all over the Trust and cannot continue. The cut off time for pre-booking lunches has been set to midnight on a Thursday evening for THE FOLLOWING WEEK. If pre-bookings are not made by that time, you will be called to bring in a packed lunch for your child. We will not be able to book them a lunch at school for you anymore. If you need any help with your ParentPay account and booking meals, please contact the school office - it is essential that all parents are using this new system.

AFRICAN DRUMMING WORKSHOP

On **12th October** as part of our celebration of Black History month, we have arranged an African Drumming Workshop for all Trinity children. The drumming workshop is suitable for all ages as a great introduction to rhythm and basic percussion techniques. They provide djembes and percussion instruments for every child to join in. The children play traditional instruments and sing songs from West Africa. The workshop is aligned to targets within Key Stages One and Two of the Music National Curriculum. Using traditional African djembe drums, children create sounds and music from the African continent. Every child immerses themselves in a different culture whilst experiencing a feeling of unity as part of a drum circle.

We are asking for a contribution of £2.50 per child which will be on ParentPay soon.
