Class News:

In Acorns, we have been learning about Autumn and noticing all of the changes in the world around us. The children have produced lovely artwork of trees using all of the beautiful autumnal colours - please pop your head into our room and have a look at our display boards. We have been using conkers, Autumn leaves and pine cones to help us with our play and investigations, also using magnifying glasses to look closely at them. We have even used scales to weigh and discuss those which were heavy and light, as well as counting them. Over the past few weeks, we have focused on two books to help

our learning: "The Leaf Thief" and "Don't Hog the Hedge". These have been great books to help us recognise the change in colours during Autumn, and to

understand that the leaves fall off the trees during this season. We have learned about animals that hibernate and how they get ready for this during the Autumn time. 'Hibernate' was a new word for us. I wonder if your child will remember if you ask them about it?

We have been doing lots of singing during our group times. "Old Macdonald" has been a firm favourite with the children as has using number rhymes/songs such as "5 Little Ducks" to help us with our numbers and counting.

We enjoy being outdoors and are lucky to have the sheltered space outside of our classroom, meaning we are able to get out in all weathers. We have particularly enjoyed exploring the water trays with various teapots, jugs, fruit tea, coloured water and fruit slices to squeeze. The children are having so much fun that we do not realise we are gaining strength in our hands, wrists and fingers at the same time, which helps us to get ready for writing in Reception! There is also a lot of sharing, turn taking, negotiations and conversations happening, which is great for our communication and social development.

Conker Class



Class News:

We have had a fun few weeks in Conkers. The children have settled into full day routines quickly and smoothly, coming in with big smiles ready to start their morning challenges with gusto.

This week, we are practising using pipettes, showing our skills at jigsaws, looking at the graphemes we have learned and making sentences using the colourful semantics format of 'who' and 'what doing'.

In Phonics, we have already learned 12 sounds and are really thinking about how to spot objects that start with these, and how to segment words that use them such as 'pig' and 'nap'.

We love having library books each week and sharing books with our Year 6 buddies. In class, we are reading in groups and taking these home to share. Please read them with your child at least four times a week.

In Maths, we have thought about size and length. Have you seen on the door our 'mini me's' showing approximately how tall we are now? We are now looking at repeating patterns and went on an Autumn walk collecting natural objects that we then used to create our own patterns.

In Science, we have looked at the forces *push* and *pull* and are now investigating how these apply to magnets.

Can you find anything magnetic in your house?

For RE, we have been thinking about one of our school Christian Values - friendship. We read "The Good Samaritan" and talked about how the characters did or did not show friendship. We discussed what made a good friend and some of us were even awarded with our 'Fantastic Friend' badges.

We had our first PE session this week. The children tried their hardest to change independently and have been working on how to turn clothes in the right way. Practising this at home would support our progress in school.

In drawing club, we have learned lots of words. 'Ambush' was one of our new words last week, and this week we are using the word 'collaborating'. I wonder if your child can tell you what they mean?

We are looking forward to extending our work on "The Little Red Hen" over the next two weeks, we may even bake some bread!

Cedar Class



Class News:

We have been building up to many celebrations over the last few weeks including: Numbots Day, Trinity's Art Excellence Exhibition, Black History Month and Harvest.

In Maths, we are in the middle of our *place value* topic. The children have been working hard on partitioning numbers in different ways and estimating and ordering numbers on a number line. In our *Number Sense* sessions we have been making and breaking numbers and applying these skills when playing Numbots - this helps us to improve our speed and quick recall. I was amazed by the outfits and maths skills on Numbots Day, but I was even more impressed with the way Cedar Class showed friendship when helping Conkers during the Numbots battle.

In Art, we have continued to focus on our drawing skills where we have learned mark making techniques such as cross hatching and stippling. We have continued to develop our bears using charcoal, oil pastels and pencils. Next week we will develop our drawings into our very own story characters and will be becoming illustrators.

On Monday, we had a super exciting trip to meet an author and illustrator in Bath. *Nadia Shireen* captivated the children with her story, but the highlight had to be the live drawing session where the children were able to learn how to draw two of Nadia's characters *Fat Cat* and *Geoffrey*. The children have been so inspired by this they have continued to make story books and characters in class, including playdough *Jitters* and *Fat Cat's Kitten Adventures!*

In History, we are continuing to learn about the life of *Mary Seacole* and how she broke social rules to travel the world, run businesses and help those in need – even in the most dangerous places. Next, we are going to be comparing her life and work to *Florence Nightingale* - both having a huge impact on the nursing profession.

Class News:

It has been a busy few weeks for Willow Class! In Maths, we are coming to the end of our place value topic. The children have been working hard on estimating numbers to 1,000 on a number line and ordering numbers to 1,000 in ascending and descending order. Our next topic, which we will start next week, is going to be on *addition* and *subtraction*.

In English, the children have continued to write sentences based on a fairy tale story. The children have continued to read the novel: "The True Story of the Three Little Pigs" and have created some incredible detailed sentences linked with the story. We have specifically been focusing on onomatopoeia and similes within our writing and the children have been coming up with some fantastic examples of similes!

In Science, we have continued our rocks topic. Last week, the children used chocolate, sweets and marshmallows

to understand how *sedimentary*, *igneous* and *metamorphic* rocks are formed. This week, we started our first science experiment! The children will be investigating three rock samples and will have to identify which category they belong in.

In Geography, the children have continued learning about mountains. We spent the last week understanding how mountains are formed and what the three types of mountains are. This week, the children were introduced to volcanoes and had the challenge of labelling the different features of a volcano.

Finally, last Friday the children celebrated TTRockstars day. The children all made a fantastic effort and we all had a great day practising our times tables!

Willow Class, you have worked incredibly hard over the last few weeks, keep it up!


