With the exception of some of the oldest children who walk home on their own, the pupils will be handed over or directed to you on the playground. Any children taking part in school-run clubs are taken to the club leader, while children attending Superstars are handed over to their members of staff. If someone different is picking up your child, then please either let your child's teacher or the school office know.

### **Celebration Assembly**





### **Thought of the Week**
