What a busy last few weeks of term we have had in Acorns. We have been thinking about healthy eating, talking about which foods are healthy or unhealthy. The children have particularly enjoyed making their own sandwiches with healthy fillings which they ate outside as a picnic snack. The role play area has been turned into the 'Acorns Restaurant.' This has provided lots of opportunities for the children to 'mark make' as they write down customer orders, and the chefs have been busy preparing the food in the kitchen. We have colour matched the plates and cups and learned to negotiate and take turns with our friends to share the various roles.

In Maths, we have been focusing on shapes. We have talked about how many sides and corners each shape has and the children loved going on a walk around the school to notice shapes within the environment. We have also started thinking about prepositions. In particular: 'on/under' and 'in/out'. We have been singing the nursery rhyme "Humpty Dumpty" to help with this.

In Literacy, we have been reading the story: "Anna Hibiscus Splash". This has sparked lots of conversations about fun times we have had ourselves at a beach, on holiday or with our families. We have thought about the different family members we have and what we call them. We have also looked at traditional clothes that are worn in Africa, listened to African music and played African instruments.

We can't believe it's time to say goodbye to our older Acorns as they move onto their next chapter and start in Reception Class. We hope you have lots of fun and settle in quickly with your new teachers. Don't forget to pop back to Acorns to tell us how you're getting on.

Class News:

Wow, where has this year gone? It only seems a few weeks ago that we were meeting all your amazing children and now we have to say goodbye and reluctantly pass them on.

Over the past three weeks, we have been finishing our work on the Sun. We have written our own class story thinking about using exciting language to be amazing authors. The children have loved role playing, going on a camping adventure and thinking about the necessary provisions we would need to take with us. As a class, we have built pirate ships out of the large construction sets and made patches and telescopes. We also created sunsets by mixing yellow and red, then made silhouette shadows on them.

In Maths, we have been thinking about capacity and using the terms 'nearly full', 'half full', 'half empty' and 'nearly empty'. We used 'cupfuls' and 'spoonfuls' to make our own playdough. The children have estimated how many items would fit in different sized containers and then checked to see how accurate we were.

We loved having Jack's special family member join us for Show and Tell. Richard was a huge hit with the children who got to touch him and ask some very interesting questions. I wonder if anyone can remember what Richard likes to eat? Mrs Athay definitely made a new friend!

The class has been thinking about recycling and why this is so important. We looked at how beautiful our world is and how sad it is that not everyone is looking after it. We used old packaging to create our own models, recycling what other people think is rubbish. We have found out what happens to both paper and glass when they get recycled. I wonder if over the summer the children could help you recycle?

Thank you for all your support in helping your children grow so much this year. It has been an absolute pleasure to work with them and we all wish them an amazing well deserved summer break.










Class News:

CofE Inspection

As you may already know, as a church school, we are inspected by the National Society on behalf of the Church of England every few years in line with Section 48 of the Education Act 2005. This SIAMS inspection makes judgements on religious education, collective worship, and pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural education. This coming September, the SIAMS Framework is changing and the inspections will look a little different.

These key changes are:

- grades will be replaced by one of two statements
- schools will need a theologically rooted Christian vision
- inspection questions will focus on impact instead of lists of criteria
- the school's context will play a greater role
- there will be a greater emphasis on the MATs accountability

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THOUGHT OF THE WEEK

As we begin our summer holiday today and have more time, we hope that many of you will have the opportunity to be outdoors and explore our Countryside. This week's thought explores how we can be respectful and demonstrate our Christian Values while we are enjoying ourselves.

A new UK government campaign hopes to encourage young people to 'respect, protect and enjoy' the countryside. The campaign follows new research from Natural England, which shows that 80% of children and young people agreed that looking after the environment was important to them, and 83% said they wanted to do more to look after nature and wildlife. The well-known cartoon character, Shaun the Sheep is the new face of the Countryside Code.

Christians believe God created the wonderful world and everything in it. In the Bible, we can find the story of creation. God created the seas and dry land, the plants and the trees. He also created us. God gave the world to us. As stewards of the world, Christians have a responsibility to protect, respect and care for all of creation.

Lunches

Data collection forms will be sent out in September for checking/amending, signing and returning. It is essential that we have up to date contact details on the system so do please let us know of any changes.

Car Park

If you have not yet sent us your up to date blue badge for disabled parking, or re-applied for special permission from Mrs Parsons, please do so before September. Previous arrangements will not automatically continue, and we do have to limit car park access to those who have permission, due to the lack of space and resulting safety issues. The drop-off system remains in place in the mornings gates will open at 8.30am or as soon as a member of staff can be on duty outside. Gates open to those with permission to park at 3pm. Pedestrian gates will be opened at 3.05pm.


