We had a visit from our Education Welfare Officer this week who oversees attendance in the school. Figures have dropped due to Covid with many children having been off once or even twice with this. There were two main messages that we need to pass on to parents regarding attendance, Firstly, that all absences need to be called or emailed in by 9am in the morning. This should happen every day a child is absent, unless of course you already know they won't be in the subsequent day/days (e.g. sickness with a 48-hour absence). Secondly, we need to let you know that children should not be leaving school early unless this is for a one-off appointment, such as visiting the doctor. Where an agreement has previously been made, this will no longer be authorised after the Easter break.

Ian Groves has been running our breakfast club for two weeks now and although the children attending are enjoying it, not many families are currently using the facility. If this is something you may want longer term, we would ask you to consider trying it this term as if numbers do not increase to around 6 or 7 a day, he may not be able to continue with it.

Finally, our fantastic FOLS are busy organising Easter events for the last day of term including Easter Crown workshops and an Easter Egg Hunt. Something for all the children to look forward to before the holidays.
