It has been another week of school trips with both the Starling class and Goldfinch class having been on exciting days out. The Goldfinches travelled down to Dorchester on Wednesday for a Tutankhamun exhibition related to their history topic of Ancient Egypt, while the Starlings have been to Radstock Museum today for a Victorian experience, also tied in to the work they have been doing in history - please see their news below.

We welcomed PCSO Mandy Ware in on Monday to talk to all of our children about staying safe online. She visited every classroom and spoke to the children about age appropriate issues relating to each class. She specifically highlighted the many issues that schools and parents face through use of mobile phones, especially in children who are very competent with the technology from a very early age (often more so than adults!) but not yet mature enough to fully understand the consequences of using certain apps, playing games that have higher age ratings, or sending messages that could be hurtful to others. We are attaching a useful document that was sent to us by Somerset County Council this week relating to staying safe online.

The office has now received over 30 parent questionnaires for the children in the school, with another 6 in the preschool. Thank you once again for all of your views and comments. Mrs Claxton is busy putting together a document to show you the results, which we should be able to send out next week. We are already taking on board some of your suggestions and as such, will be making a positive addition to our Friday assemblies. We will initially do this by phone call while we get this up and running, but after Easter this will move to an email.
