Thought of the Week

'At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth shook, the rocks split and the tombs broke open.' (Matthew 27: 51-52)



After Jesus was arrested, he was put on trial before the Sanhedrin. This was a large group of Jewish leaders and they decided that Jesus was guilty of blasphemy, because he claimed that he was God.

Jesus understood this was how things would turn out. Jerusalem was occupied by the Romans and so the Jewish leaders had to approach Pontius Pilate, who was the Roman governor at that time. He had the power to have Jesus killed or released.

Romans generally didn't have a problem with killing people, especially if their presence was causing trouble. Many of the Jewish leaders were so keen to get rid of Jesus, that they had stirred up the people and there was a vast crowd demanding that Jesus be crucified. Even with all of this, Pilate still wasn't keen to have him killed.

Pilate said he would release a prisoner as a token of goodwill, because it was the Passover festival. Believing that Jesus was totally innocent, he was hoping that the crowds would ask for him to be released. But they called for Barabbas, a known murderer, to be released instead. It seems preposterous that Jesus would have been killed like he was and that a convicted murderer would be released in his place. Only if this was planned by God himself could it have happened this way.

Christians believe that this was always God's intention. God is a holy God, who cannot cope with all the bad things we do. We have been given a life to live, but we should live it in accordance with God's guidelines. That seems fair, if he created it all in the first place.

Unfortunately none of us have lived our lives perfectly and we have said and done things that have upset others and also God. Like with all situations like this, there needs to be a punishment to make amends. God is a holy God, but he is also a just God, so justice demands we should be punished.

The wonderful thing about Good Friday, is that because God is also a God of love, he agreed to take the punishment in our place. This is why Christians focus on the cross so much - it is a symbol of sacrifice, freedom and love. It means we can be forgiven and don't have to be punished anymore.

So why was the curtain in the temple torn in two? Up until this point, only the high priest had access to God once a year behind that huge curtain. Now, because of Jesus' death, everyone has full access to God whenever and wherever they are. And again, this is something that only God could have done.
