The Reception children have enjoyed their new environment of the Memorial Hall. Many thanks again to the committee for letting us use the facility. The timings at the beginning and end of the day have also worked well; thanks to all of you who have been dropping off and picking up for being flexible with these.

We have had feedback from several parents on the issue of home learning, which have been passed on to the members of the Trust who are collating it all. This should mean some positive changes for next week including all the White Rose questions and answers, greater detail around the work and also the work for the whole week being available before the weekend. The Trust are also looking at potentially adding some work for Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 who are not in school; we will keep you posted.

When I was working with Year 6 this week we looked at the Virtual Summer School Games. Each year Wesport put on winter, spring and summer games, which we as a school have qualified for previously in sports such as athletics, gymnastics and tri-golf. Because of school closure they are leading a virtual event which any child aged 5-16 can take part in. They are putting a weekly event for children to practise and then submit a score. I will be doing this with Year 6 each week, but any child can practise at home and then fill in their results.
