

Thought of the Week

'But the man said, "Don't be afraid. You are looking for Jesus from Nazareth, the one who was killed on a cross. He has risen from death. He is not here. Look, here is the place they laid him.' (Mark 16:6)



'Easter, Empty Tomb' Jesus Mafa (1973)

Mark's Gospel is believed to be the earliest Gospel, written, about 70 AD, about 35-40 years after the Easter story events. This was while some of the people who were involved were still alive. Mark wouldn't have been in a position to make these things up. In fact, he would have been in the privileged position of being able to ask some of the eyewitnesses what they saw.

The earliest examples of Mark's Gospel end at verse 8 of chapter 16 (Mark 16:1-8) and so it is believed by many that verses 9-20, where Jesus appears to his disciples and others, were added on later. So if the earliest written Gospel doesn't mention Jesus appearing to anyone, was Jesus' resurrection all made up?

These eight verses tell us so much. One thing is that the focus is on the women going to anoint Jesus' body. This still happens today in some poor mideast countries. It is done as a sign of respect, but more importantly to make up for the lack of refrigeration and modern embalming methods. The fragrant spices mask the odour of decay while there are people still visiting.

In ancient times, women were not seen as legitimate witnesses, but Mark states that these were the first people to find the tomb empty. People might want to discount their story, but Mark has put it down in writing, giving it real authority.

What about this man? No shining clothes or wings are mentioned, yet the women were afraid. Why? Jesus' body was gone and there was an unknown man in the tomb in his place, but what caused them to 'shake with fear'.

The verses end with the statement 'They did not tell anyone about what happened, because they were afraid.' Jesus had said on several occasions that he was going to rise from the dead, but like the disciples, these women didn't get it. Well why should they? People don't generally come back to life after being killed and buried.

But even though it says they did not tell anyone, word got around. Whether they told the disciples later, or the disciples visited the tomb themselves, or the soldiers went and spoke to their leaders, word got around. And it's been getting around ever since, for over 2000 years. From Jerusalem, into Israel, Antioch, Alexandria and Rome. From there into Asia, Greece and North Africa until it became the official religion of the Roman Empire.

It's a fantastical story but it still holds so much power. He is not here! He has risen from death!
