In our last week before the holidays, we celebrated the upcoming Easter with a Peter Rabbit book and lots of writing about rabbits and chocolate eggs. We all had phonics assessments, the children's hard work really shone through with amazing results. We finished the week with lots of fun and plenty of Easter crafts.





In Starling class this week we had great fun baking some Easter cookies. We used our English skills to read the recipe and our maths skills to weigh out all the ingredients.
