This time the theme is all around repair and reuse, which means

- The Fixy Van is coming to Farrington Gurney. The van will collect all your defunct digital devices, wipe and restore them if they can, and then provide them to those who have none OR strip and recycle every inch of the machine. Their promise: NOTHING goes to landfill. They will take any or all digital devices except for monitors.
- Coming with the Fixy team is High Littleton repair café; they work to repair small electrical devices like kettles. So bring along those things that need repairing and are too good to waste!
- We will have a team of sewing experts on tap who have a ton of projects for kids and adults that include

o Patching clothes with colourful, hand-designed patches so those jeans, that jacket gets better use. Bring anything along that needs a patch!

o Making Farrington Gurney bunting – for village celebrations

Thought of the Week

'The faithful love of the LORD never ends! His mercies never cease. Great is his faithfulness; his mercies begin afresh each morning.' (Lamentations 3:22-23)

Well we're told that spring has arrived, but apart from the occasional day, the weather doesn't seem to agree. On Monday this week, we had wind, followed by rain, followed by glorious sunshine, followed by more wind and rain and finally hail. To quote Crowded House, it was literally like 'Four Seasons In One Day'.

I don't know about you, but the weather often has an effect on me. The fact that the days are longer has a positive effect, but rain, wind and clouds can really make you feel down. Unless of course if it is like Monday, where the weather was so ridiculous, I couldn't help but laugh.

The writer of Lamentations had lots to feel down about. The city of Jerusalem had been taken over by the Babylonians and most of the people had been deported. A few people were left to stay behind in terrible conditions - a broken and shattered city. One way people expressed their grief and shame over the destruction of their home was to write songs. It is believed that the prophet Jeremiah wrote the songs that make up the book of Lamentations. The writer "laments" over the desperate situation the Jewish people are in. You can see how it got its name.

But in the middle of the book, there are some brief moments where it feels like the sun has broken through. Jeremiah reminds himself of God's great faithfulness. In fact, verse 23 is the verse attributed to the famous hymn 'Great Is Thy Faithfulness' by Thomas Chisholm. In the midst of all the terrible things that Jeremiah has observed and experienced, he reminds himself that there is hope in God.

Sometimes we can find ourselves focusing on the negatives. In fact, it's often the case that something small like bad traffic or terrible weather can start us off in a bad mood that leads us down a rabbit hole of grumpiness and misery. It's at times like this that we, like Jeremiah, need to take our focus from the negative things and try and focus on the positive things.

Whether you believe in God or not, there is often something we can find hope in. Hope literally means 'the joyful anticipation of good'. There is often something that we can find joy in, something that we can be excited about. For many, this can be found in spending time with those we love or maybe by enjoying nature. For those of us who worship God, we might find joy and hope in our relationship with him.

Whatever it is, I hope you can experience some hope and joy in the midst of all the bad stuff in the world. And let's hope and pray that the weather also improves!
