Additionally, children have been outside bird spotting, writing down and drawing pictures of the birds they have seen.








HT Award

A good start to the term Cedar Class - I can't wait to see what you send me next week!






HT Award





Cherry Class



Class News:






They will need you to tell them your National Insurance Number or National Asylum Seeker Support Number when you call. Please note that the Local Authority will check your eligibility to qualifying benefits on your behalf using the DFE online Free School Meal Eligibility Checking Service. Your National Insurance or National Asylum Seeker Support Number and Date of Birth must be completed clearly and accurately.
